

A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

Mary knows that it is hard to keep the clutter out of our hearts. We tend to get distracted by life's hustle and bustle, by the shiny things of the world, even though they aren't the most important things. She knows we need help learning how to reflect deeply on God's action in our lives, and she has given us that help. She has given us a tool for developing our interior life that has a 100% success rate. Everyone who has used this tool has come closer to God and grown in wisdom, courage, and joy. This tool was given by Mary in a vision to St Dominic in the thirteenth century. Since then it has been used successfully by illiterate peasants and cultured queens, popes and bishops, mothers and widows, sailors and soldiers. All of us know about it, but not enough of us use it. It's called the Rosary. The Rosary is a key letting us into Mary's heart, where we can sit with her, as if we were having a cup of tea together in her parlor, just the two of us. Why not make the resolution to spend this year learning from our Spiritual Mother how to let God put order, peace, and wisdom into our lives, by "keeping all these things and reflecting on them in our hearts" through the Rosary. If we take even that small step closer to Christ, He will surely take a giant leap closer to us.



The Carmelite Corner

READINGS: GAL 4:1-7 LK 2:33-40

SUNDAY IN THE OCTAVE OF CHRISTMAS

V. Praised be Jesus Christ...

R. Now and forever!

Dum médium siléntium tenérent ómnia, et nox in suo cursu médium iter habéret, omnípotens sermo tuus, Dómine, de cœlis a regálibus sédibus venit. While all things were in quiet silence and the night was in the midst of her course, Thy almighty Word, O Lord, leaped down from heaven from Thy royal throne. [ECCL 18:14-15]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we have an abrupt change from the angels, shepherds, Magi, and all the hullabaloo. Prior to today's Gospel, Simeon had received divine inspiration that he would not die until he had seen the Anointed One of God. In first century Judaism - Mary and Joseph follow the law, "Consecrate to me all the firstborn; whatever is the first to open the womb among the Israelites, of human beings and animals, is mine" [i.e. God's, Exodus 13:2]. Normal folks doing normal things. However, Simeon takes the Christ-Child into his arms, rejoicing at the fulfillment of the promise - and we receive the canticle for Compline [Night Prayer] from Luke 2:29-30, the Nunc dimittis: "Lord, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation..." This normal event is turned on its head. In the Gospel, Mary and Joseph are amazed at this. Then Simeon, filled with the Holy Spirit, prophesizes that the Child will lead to much upheaval of the established order and will be a sign [literally] spoken against [εἰς σημεῖον ἀντιλεγόμενον = eis sēmeion antilegomenon]. Mary hears that her son will endure much opposition; how could she know what this fully entailed. Then comes the ominous personal affliction of Our Lady - a sword shall pierce her heart, literally "breath, the soul" [$\psi v \chi \dot{\eta} v = p s y c h \bar{e} n$]; so that the thoughts of may be laid bare. Her Son will be the cause of her to suffer much. We get a preview of His mission – the precious Infant is already heading towards Calvary.

The Carmelite realizes that the mystery of the Incarnation and the redemptive act is profound and to be embraced; one also knows that in the mystery of human free will, that not all embrace this. Thus, the Carmelite lives one's life in prayer and penance for the conversion and salvation of souls – essentially, doing the work for others that they themselves will not do [yet]. It seems that humanity wants the Nativity, but it flees when the joy gives way to the stark reality of what Christ's mission entails. However, let us now hold the Babe to our hearts with joy at this time, reveling in the fact that God is with us; soon enough, there will be time to blot the tears of Our Blessed Mother.

May the Infant King grant us all choicest blessings from His tiny hands!


