A Note From Our Pastor



My Dear Parishioners,

Christ is risen! His Holy Spirit has unlocked the doors of Heaven, which stand open to receive those who rise up from the earth. Jesus Christ has shown Himself the great High Priest who offered Himself in suffering and death only to reverse their effects and conquer sin, death and suffering and to offer hope through His Resurrection. This is a victory that we celebrate through all time, because His one sacrifice gives us access to live with the Holy Spirit and recognize the Father's perfect Love.

The great sign the Gospel gives us today is that Jesus' tomb is empty. We have to look no more among the dead for He who is alive has risen. And His disciples, that later on will see Him risen, that is, will experience Him alive in a wonderful meeting in faith, also realize His tomb is empty. An empty tomb and apparitions will be the great signs for the believer's faith. Bede the Venerable (8th century) wrote, "[The angel] rolled back the stone not to throw open a way for our Lord to come forth, but to provide evidence to people that He had already come forth." No tomb on earth can hold the Lord; no material stone, however heavy, can obstruct Him.

The Resurrection is the stamp that validates everything Jesus did and said: His claim to be God's Son, to have authority to forgive sin and reestablish communion between God and man; His universal call to abandon self-centeredness for love of God and neighbor as the path to true happiness; His promise to give grace through a Church that will endure forever. If Jesus had not been raised, none of that would be worth listening to. He would have been just one more nice guy who finished last, one more dreamer whose dreams were squelched by the harsh reality of real life. This is why whenever people start living against Christ's teachings and example they always raise doubts about the reality of the Resurrection.

After all, if Christ didn't rise from the dead, He has no more authority over our lives than Socrates or Confucius or Buddha or Mohammad, or even Dr. Phil. But He did rise from the dead. His victory over evil and falsehood and injustice and suffering is total, incontrovertible, and irreversible. In the face of twenty centuries filled with a steady stream of saints, an unchecked growth of the Catholic Church, and an unquenchable Christian vitality, no reasonable person can deny it.

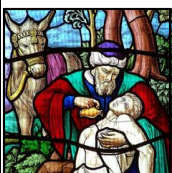

AN EASTER MESSAGE FROM OUR BISHOP

'He has been raised!'

Jesus of Nazareth lived most of his life in obscurity without much notoriety or attention paid to him. The Gospels tell us about his birth in Bethlehem and, later, about his appearance in the temple at age 12. Other than that, the Gospels are largely silent about Jesus of Nazareth until he appears before John the Baptist in the Jordan and begins his public ministry around age 30. Those hidden years of Jesus' life leave everything to the imagination and to speculation. And while that is true of Jesus of Nazareth, the Jesus of history, it is not true of Jesus the Messiah, the Christ of faith.

A thousand years or more of Old Testament writings and traditions kept the Messiah before the Jewish people's minds and in their hopes and expectations before the "Word became flesh and dwelt among us." They are not two different persons, no. They are one and the same. Jesus the Messiah, the Christ of faith is eternal but chose to live in a specific, identifiable, historic time period, hence the title, "Jesus of history." It is the New Testament, especially the Gospels, that connect all that was planned and foretold about the Messiah with Jesus of Nazareth. And the events of Holy Week have made that abundantly clear.

The week began with Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem and continued with his celebration of Passover with the Twelve Apostles. The week ended with his brutal crucifixion and death. The Church's liturgies for Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday and Good Friday painted the picture in a most dramatic way and led us to Jesus' tomb. Although Jesus was an "unknown" for most of his life, he certainly attracted enough attention in his last three years of his earthly existence to lift people's hopes that the Messiah had come, and the Messiah was he! But when he died in a most humiliating way, the hopes of his followers that he was the Messiah were dashed ... But that was not the end of the story, as we know.

John's Gospel tells us that when the women came to the tomb in which Jesus was buried, the stone was already rolled back; his body was not there; the tomb was empty. "He has been raised; he is not here" they were told by the angel. Jesus of Nazareth is the Christ of faith, the Messiah - everything that had been said and predicted about him had been fulfilled, had come true. The Lord Jesus Christ has risen from the dead. That is what we Christians celebrate at Easter and that is what joins us with baptized Catholics throughout the world.

For all of us who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, Easter is the heart of our faith - its life, its breath, its everything. There is no more significant human expression than faith in Jesus' Resurrection. He didn't just die and come back to life. He was not revived or resuscitated. Jesus' Resurrection is about new life, transformed life, a completely different order of existence. He rose from the dead leaving death behind him. The tomb is empty. This is about glory and triumph.

"Christ once raised from the dead shall never die again; death has no more power over him." And the source of our Easter joy is that he offers the same triumph and glory to us who believe in him. That is the meaning of our Baptism when we say we die in Christ only to rise in him, new, changed, different, filled with grace and light and life. Easter is that moment in human history when the world was changed forever: changed by an obscure Jesus of Nazareth who lived and died but who rose to new life, Jesus Christ the Messiah of God, the Christ of our faith!

Amen! Alleluia! Happy Easter!

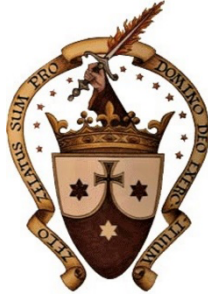

The Carmelite Corner

EASTER SUNDAY

Christus resurrexit! – Resurrexit vere!

Χριστὸς ἀνέστη! – Ἀληθῶς ἀνέστη!

Christ is risen! – He is truly risen!

Ῥ. Praised be Jesus Christ...

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, our Introit [opening song] greets us with this joyful burst from Psalm 138. The Father raises up the Son, and the Son is still with us. The knowledge of the victory over sin and death, with the opening of Heaven to believers – this is too great for us poor mortals to fully comprehend. But as the Gradual of today says, this is the day that the Lord has made – let us rejoice and be glad in it – with incomparable joy.

For those of us in Latin Rite, the traditional greeting on Easter morning is "Christ is risen" to which the response is "He is risen indeed. Alleluia!" This ancient phrase echoes the greeting of the angel to Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joseph as they arrived at the sepulcher to anoint the body of Jesus: "He is not here; for he has risen, as he said" [Mt 28:6]. Easter is the "sabbath of sabbaths" – the highest-ranking feast on the calendar – it is so wonderful, that all the way through to next Sunday [the Octave or eight days after Easter] is treated as Easter Day itself. The Carmelite joins with the universal Church in the joy of this holy time, and Easter brings us to the summit of fellowship with Christ – at least in this life. The penances of dying to self is rewarded by union with the risen life of the Master – a foretaste of life with Him forever. Sufferings are rewarded and the chains of death are broken – we do not say, "Happy Easter" – we say, "Alleluia! He is risen indeed!"

To Jesus Christ be all glory forever, alleluia!

"I want to tell you again here lest someone think that the reason is solely for the sake of giving delight to these souls; that thought would be a serious error. His Majesty couldn't grant us a greater favor than to give us a life that would be an imitation of the life His beloved Son lived. Thus I hold for certain that these favors are meant to fortify our weakness... that we may be able to imitate Him..."

This is the reason for prayer, my daughters, the purpose of this spiritual marriage: the birth always of good works, good works... This is what I want us to strive for, my Sisters; and let us desire and be occupied in prayer not for the sake of our enjoyment but so as to have the strength to serve... The Lord doesn't look so much at the greatness of our works as at the love with which they are done."
