A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday we will celebrate a Sunday of the Word of God. I would like to share a quote from the Ordo which explains it well. "In his *motu proprio* of September 30, 2019, *Aperuit Illis*, Pope Francis has declared that 'the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the Word of God. This Sunday of the Word of God will thus be a fitting part of that time of year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity.' A day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord, who continues to speak His word and to break bread in the community of believers."

A very good way to prepare for Sunday is to read the Sunday readings from Scripture. If you go to the USCCB (www.USCCB.org) website, you can find a link for the weekend readings. In fact, they even have the daily readings as well. It is a really good practice to prepare for Sunday Mass by reflecting on the readings before Mass each week. In the opening lines of Pope Francis' *motu proprio*, he explains the importance of the scriptures in our Christian life. He claims, "He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures" (Lk 24:45). This was one of the final acts of the risen Lord before his Ascension. Jesus appeared to the assembled disciples, broke bread with them and opened their minds to the understanding of the Sacred Scriptures. To them, amid their fear and bewilderment, He unveiled the meaning of the paschal mystery: that in accordance with the Father's eternal plan He had to suffer and rise from the dead, in order to bring repentance and the forgiveness of sins (cf. Lk 24:26,46-47). He then promised to send the Holy Spirit, who would give them strength to be witnesses of this saving mystery (cf. Lk 24:49). The relationship between the Risen Lord, the community of believers and Sacred Scripture is essential to our identity as Christians."

Let us heed the advice of our Holy Father and build on our knowledge of the Sacred Scriptures.





Next Sunday begins the Liturgical Period of Septuagesima January 28 - February 13, 2024

"The Liturgical period of Septuagesima is a prelude to Lent and a remote preparation for Easter. It serves as a time of transition for the soul, which must pass from Christmas joys to the stern penance of the sacred forty days. Even if the fast is not yet of obligation, the color of the vestments worn is already violet. As during Advent, the recital of the Gloria in excelsis is suspended."

Next Sunday, January 28, we will begin **Septuagesima**, the special 3-week preparation for the season of Lent in the Traditional Catholic Calendar. The three Sundays before Ash Wednesday (which is on February 14, 2024) are:



Septuagesima Sunday January 28, 2024

Sexagesima Sunday February 4, 2024

Quinquagesima Sunday February 11, 2024

The first Sunday of this time of preparation is called *Septuagesima* and is followed by *Sexagesima* and then *Quinquagesima*. These are Latin words for "Seventy days," "Sixty days," and "Fifty days," referring to the symbolic number of days before Easter Sunday. During this time before the beginning of Lent and during the forty days of Lent, violet vestments are worn and the Alleluia and Gloria are not sung.

The Carmelite Corner

THE THIRD SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Adoráte Deum omnes Ángeli ejus: audivit, et lætáta est Sion: et exsultavérunt filiæ Judæ.

Adore God, all ye his Angels: Sion heard, and was glad: and the daughters of Juda rejoiced. [Ps. 96:7,8]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Gospel of today brings us to Our Lord being well on His mission. Already multitudes are following, so His fame must have been spreading for a while. In Jewish society of the day, a leper had no business being in public. They were declared unclean, and, in Jewish thought, this surely was recompense for some sin. The poor man is an outcast, and sin casts us out of friendship with Christ. And yet – the leper is undaunted by his state – he KNOWS that Jesus can cure him, if He wills. Jesus rewards the man's faith; do we KNOW that He can do this for us, as well?

The Carmelite realizes that all of humanity has 'leprosy' of some kind – this presents itself as attachment to sin. The Gospel admonition of, "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect. [MT 5:48]" is taken very seriously and literally. We promise to live a life in conformance to the evangelical counsels of chastity [according to our state in life], poverty, and obedience. Also, we live according to the Beatitudes. The Secular Order member works a job and supports a family – it is not the same brand of poverty as is it is for the Nuns – they have a cross, a bed, a desk, and a chair in their cells – and that is about it. The one life that God has granted each of these Nuns is spent in joyful prayer and penance – a truly remarkable and beautiful vocation! The poverty for all of Carmel consists primarily in poverty of spirit – a poverty that consists of vocation to continual prayer, and of detachment from the world, while on a mission to do good. Those in the world have their spiritual "cells" where one goes to pray in detachment, working as anonymously as possible for any good that can be achieved. Again, literally, "But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. [MT 6:6]." As we progress in Carmel, it becomes more joyful to follow "a man of suffering and acquainted with infirmity [Is 53:3a]."

Returning to our themes of today – the leper is what we all should be like – abiding in abject humility, but with unshakable confidence ["con" = "with" & "fides" = "faith"] in the good God who can do any and all things, according to His holy and adorable will. Prayer is our "invincible arms" with which we beg Our Father, in the name of Jesus Christ, to grant desires of our hearts and for all needful things in this often difficult world – that these be for our good and may redound to His glory – and to Jesus Christ be all glory!

"Miserable though I am, I firmly believe that You can do what You will; and greater are Your marvels that I hear spoken of, and the more I reflect that You can work others still greater, the stronger grows my faith and the greater is the resolution with which I believe that You will hear my requests.

It is with deep gratitude that I report on the activities of our Saint Vincent de Paul conference here at Saint John the Baptist. Through the abundantly generous donations of our parishioners, and the cooperation of our Parish ministries, as well as some outside assistance and God's will, we have been able to assist many families in need during the Thanksgiving holiday and the holy season of Advent.

Beginning in November with the food drive, baskets were prepared and distributed to families we have served during the past year. Several groups were involved in this effort as well as our wonderful parishioners. I'd like to thank the Knights of Columbus, the Altar Rosary Society, and also the Ancient Order of Hibernians, Division Ten, who have partnered with us for several years now. This was all accomplished while still serving our neighbors with assistance for utilities, rent, and various other needs. These needs are filled mostly through donations to our Poor Boxes at all our church entrances, as well as direct donations to the Society. Shop Rite gift cards are also sold by the society as a fundraiser. Details on this are in the bulletin.

The main reason for this letter is to sincerely thank you all for your continued support on behalf of God's children who may be experiencing difficulties. We truly see the face of Christ in those we serve. We are happy to serve and we welcome anyone who wishes to offer their time and or talents to assist in these efforts.


