A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

Happy Feast of the Epiphany. I would like to share with you a beautiful reflection from Saint Alphonsus Ligouri:

“Jesus is born poor in a stable; the angels of heaven indeed acknowledge Him, but men abandon and forsake Him on earth. Only a few shepherds come and pay Him homage. But our Redeemer was desirous of communicating to us the grace of His redemption, and begins therefore to manifest Himself to the Gentiles, who knew Him least. Therefore He sends a star to enlighten the holy Magi, in order that they may come and acknowledge and adore their Savior. This was the first and sovereign grace bestowed upon us, our vocation to the faith; which was succeeded by our vocation to grace, of which men were deprived.

Behold the wise men, who immediately, without delay, set off upon their journey. The star accompanies them as far as the cavern where the holy Infant lies: on their arrival they enter; and what do they find? They found the child with Mary. They find a poor maiden and a poor Infant wrapped in poor swaddling clothes, without any one to attend on Him or assist Him. But, lo, on entering into the little shed these holy pilgrims feel a joy which they had never felt before; they feel their hearts chained to the dear little Infant which they behold. The straw, the poverty, the cries of their little Savior,—oh, what darts of love! Oh, what blessed flames are they to their enlightened hearts!

The Infant looks upon them with a joyful countenance, and this is the mark of affection with which He accepts them amongst the first fruits of His redemption. The holy kings then look at Mary, who does not speak—she remains silent; but with her blessed countenance that breathes the sweetness of paradise she welcomes them, and thanks them for having been the first to come and acknowledge her Son (as indeed He is) for their Sovereign Lord. See also how, out of reverence, they adore Him in silence, and acknowledge Him for their God, kissing His feet, and offering Him their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Let us also with the holy Magi adore our little King Jesus, and let us offer Him all our hearts.”

Let us welcome the child Jesus into our hearts and our homes.

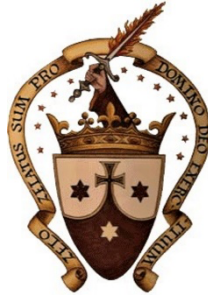

The Carmelite Corner

READINGS:

THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH

Ÿ. Praised be Jesus Christ... **Ŕ.** Now and forever!

*Exsultat gáudio pater justí, gáudeat pater tuus
et mater tua, et exsúltet quæ génuít te.*

**Let the father of the just one exult with joy: let thy
father and thy mother rejoice; and let her that bare
thee be glad. [Ps. 83:2,3]**

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we are still in Christmas-tide, but the Church turns our attention from the events of Bethlehem to the home in Nazareth. Aside from the Presentation in the Temple and the Finding of Jesus in the Temple, for the most part, an archetype of the unspectacular day-to-day living expected of us – this is reinforced by the absence of scriptural references of what occurred in the home in Nazareth. And yet, in His sacred humanity, He submitted Himself to the parenting of Joseph and Mary – omnipotent God subjecting Himself to His creatures in divine humility. God has fashioned the value of family life, and the Holy Family models this.

Carmelites have a great devotion to the Holy Family. We worship Our Lord's sacred divinity, and yet we are brothers and sisters of His sacred humanity. In short, through prayer and sacrifice we participate in the life of the Holy Family, and we pray that all families anchor the souls of our children! As revealed by Our Lady to Sr. Lúcia de Jesús Rosa dos Santos OCD [the Fatima visionary], the final assault of the evil one will be on the family. One only need to look around to see that this is well underway.

However, Carmelites *do* revel in one particular family that was rather holy – Ss. Louis and Zélie Martin. Louis repaired watches, Zélie made lace. Suffering draws us closer to the suffering Christ; within three years, their two baby boys, a five-year-old girl, and a six-and-a-half-week-old infant girl all died. The series of tragedies had intensified the love of Louis and Zélie Martin for each other. They poured out their affection on their five surviving daughters; Marie and Pauline [both became Carmelite nuns], Leonie [a Visitandine nun on her way to beatification] and Celine and [the baby] Marie-Francoise-Thérèse Martin, both Carmelite nuns. A century later people the baby is known as St. Thérèse and call her the "Little Flower" – a Doctor of the Church. From holy parents come holy children – forming holy families. May the good God reward the sacrifices of our parents and grant us all holy families!

To Jesus Christ be all glory!

"What does me a lot of good when I think of the Holy Family is to imagine a life that was very ordinary... Little Jesus didn't perform useless miracles... even to please His Mother. Why weren't they transported into Egypt by a miracle which would have been necessary and so easy for God? In the twinkling of an eye, they could have been brought there. No, everything in their life was done just as in our own. How many troubles, disappointments! How many times did others make complaints to good St. Joseph! How many times did they refuse to pay him for his work! Oh! How astonished we would be if we only knew how much they had to suffer!"

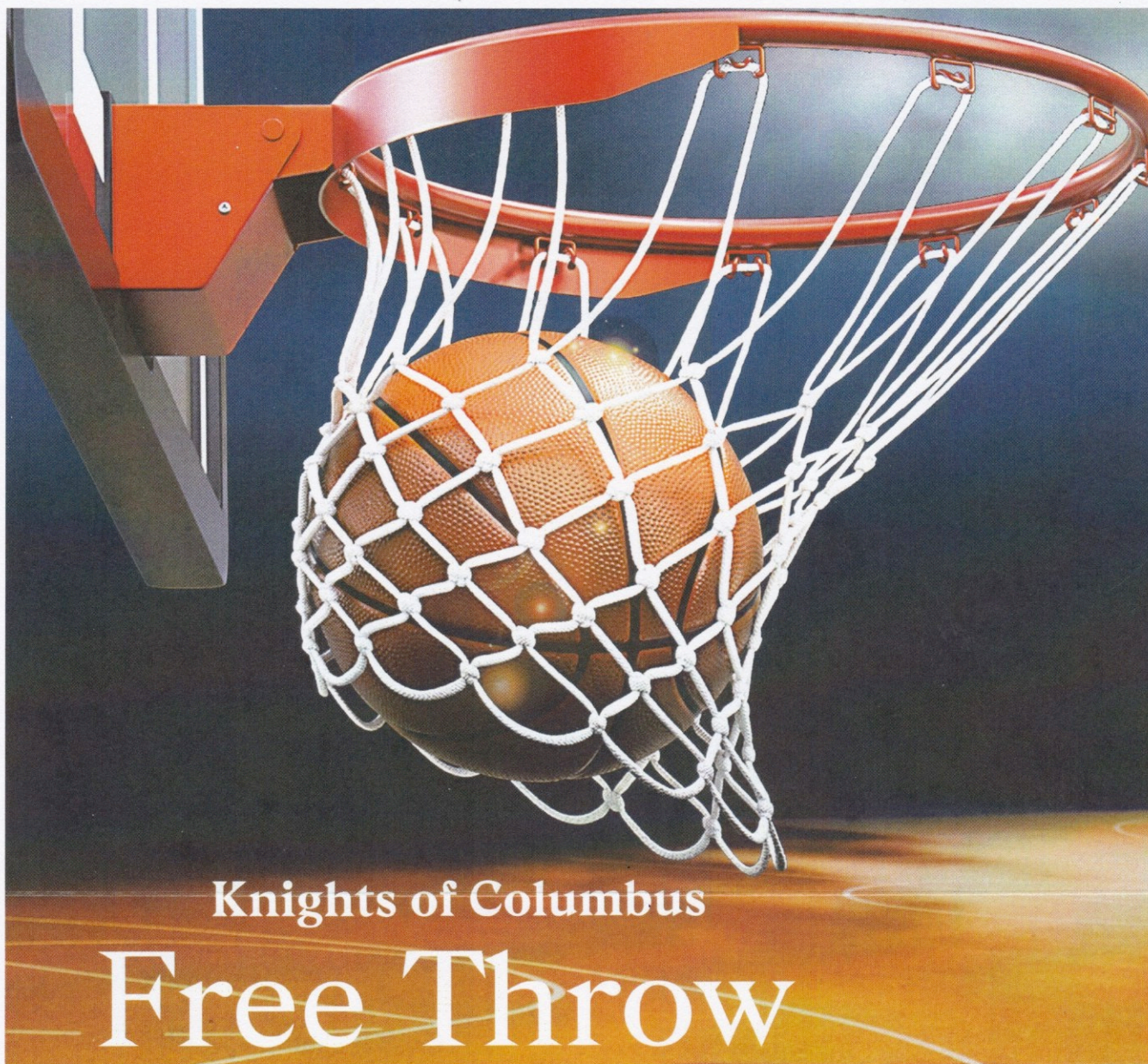
