

LENT

Fridays in Lent

All Fridays in Lent are days of **abstinence** (no meat) for all baptized Roman Catholics age 14 and over. In addition, Good Friday (April 18) is also a day of **fasting** for those age 18-59.

Lenten Friday Stations of the Cross followed by Benediction and Confessions

Join us for Stations of the Cross followed by Benediction at 7pm in the Church on Lenten Fridays (there is no Benediction on Good Friday). Confessions will follow Benediction.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

for Baptized Catholics in the United States

Good Friday is a day of obligatory FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat). No dispensation is granted on this solemn day except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law.

All other Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of days, which must be considered serious.

A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

Our Gospel this week shows the beautiful compassion and mercy our Lord has for sinners. In this story, the woman is brought before Jesus with a harsh judgment. Emotions are high and these emotions clearly cloud the rational thinking of those who are ready to stone her. Jesus cuts through this irrationality by a profound statement. "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Perhaps, at first, those who were younger or more emotional did not allow the words of Jesus to sink in. They probably stood there with stones in hand waiting to start throwing. But then the elders began to walk away. This is age and wisdom at work. They were less controlled by the emotion of the situation and were immediately aware of the wisdom of the words spoken by our Lord. As a result, the others followed.

She is expecting death. Maybe she's wishing she had a second chance. The cruelty of the Pharisees must be terrible for her. They really don't care about her at all; they just want to use her to trap Jesus. But Jesus does not condemn her. He forgives her. When He looks at her, He sees what Saint Paul says in Ephesians 2:10: "You are God's masterpiece."

Saint Augustine, commenting on this Gospel passage, says that a great misery meets a great mercy. In Latin it sounds really good: misery is *miseria* and mercy is *misericordia*. So a great *miseria* meets an even greater *misericordia*. And this leads to true conversion.

Saint Pope John Paul II once said: "We are not the sum of our weaknesses and failures; we are the sum of the Father's love for us and our real capacity to become the image of his Son."

When we meet that love, in Jesus, it moves us to change in response. This is why Jesus says to the woman, "Go, and sin no more." We are called to a new relationship with God. We come as sinners, and we leave forgiven. God is with us. Christ heals us, fills us with joy, and challenges us to be saints. Go, and sin no more.





Tenebrae Service Holy Wednesday, April 16 at 7:00pm

Tenebrae means "darkness", and it refers to the chanting of Matins/Lauds of the Divine Office on the days leading up to Easter Sunday. Following this tradition, we will chant the Matins/Lauds of Holy Thursday on Wednesday, April 16, beginning at 7:00pm. The Schola in the front pews will alternate chanting the psalm verses while the clergy chant the lessons that separate the psalms. A 15-candle "hearse" shaped like a triangle will be present. As each psalm is completed, 1 candle is extinguished, until only the top candle is left - representing the Apostles abandoning Christ in His darkest hour. Please join us for this beautiful Service.

Today is Passion Sunday Beginning of Passiontide

The Fifth Sunday of Lent is known as Passion Sunday, the first Sunday of Passiontide. Today is also known as *Júdica Sunday*, from the first word of the Introit of the Mass. Statues and crucifixes are veiled until the Gloria of the Easter Vigil. From today until Holy Thursday, the following changes occur:

- The *Júdica Me* is omitted in the priest's prayers at the foot of the Altar.
- There is no "Gloria Patri..." in the Asperges Me or after the Introit.
- There is no "Gloria Patri..." after the Lavabo.

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF OUR LORD'S PASSION

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Júdica me, Deus, et discérne causam meam de gente non sancta: ab hómine iníquo et dolóso éripe me: quia tu es Deus meus et fortitúdo mea.

Judge me, O God, and distinguish my cause from the nation that is not holy: deliver me from the unjust and deceitful man, for Thou art my God and my strength. [Ps 42: 1-2]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today is the first Sunday of Our Lord's Passion. Last week was Laetare Sunday – full of rejoicing. The Church returns to being more forlorn. We observe the covering of statues – nothing will now distract us from our focus on the sufferings of Jesus. Today's reading from Hebrews points to the new type of sacrifice that Jesus offers; if the blood of goats and calves could offer expiation for sin, then how much more is the blood of the God-man effective in atoning for sin! His sacrifice, through the operation of the Holy Spirt, will cleanse the consciences of us poor sinners from our dead works – enabling us to aspire to life everlasting. The Gospel of today is from what we hold to be an eyewitness account from the Beloved Disciple. The readings of Passiontide tell of the escalation of tensions between Jesus and the religious authorities. He no longer speaks in parable – he speaks plainly, arriving at logical conclusions which confound them. The follower of God hears the word of God; since they do not hear the words of Jesus, Our Lord convicts them in their stubbornness and sinfulness.

And what about us – are we truly hearing the voice of the Master? Many souls wish to place Our Lord on the shelf, pulling Him down for a Sunday observance. Holy Lent is a clarion call to conversion through increased prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The Carmelite realizes the great gift of penance. We aim to follow Our Lord not only at Cana, but particularly Our Lord at Calvary. In conforming ourselves into His passion and death, we prepare ourselves for life everlasting. "Ave Crux, spes unica!" exclaimed St. Edith Stein. "Hail, Thou Cross, our one hope!" Again, with no cross, there is no crown. Central to Carmelite thought is doing away with earthly attachments [even little ones], save the cross of Christ. We seek not the dead works and things of this passing life – did you ever see a U-Haul follow a hearse? Neither have we. Let us make it our care and joy to reasonably forswear the things of earth. The ice cream given up during Lent should lead us to greater things to demonstrate our burning love for Christ Crucified.

To Jesus Christ be all glory!

"Any one of these imperfections, if the soul has become attached and habituated to it, is of as great harm to its growth and progress in virtue as though it were to fall daily into many other imperfections and usual venial sins which proceed not from a habitual indulgence in any habitual and harmful attachment and will not hinder it so much as when it has attachment to anything. For as long as it has this there is no possibility that it will make progress in perfection, even though the imperfection be extremely slight. For it comes to the same thing whether a bird be held by a slender cord or by a stout one; since, even if it be slender, the bird will be well held as though it were stout, for so long as it breaks it not and flies not away. It is true that the slender one is the easier to break; still, easy though it be, the bird will not fly away if it be not broken. And thus, the soul that has attachment to anything, however much virtue it possesses, will not attain to the liberty of Divine union."



HOLY WEDNESDAY, APRIL 16, 2025 7:00PM IN THE CHURCH

Tenebrae means "darkness" or "shadows", and it refers to the chanting of Matins/Lauds of the Divine Office on the days leading up to Easter Sunday. In the earliest centuries, this was chanted shortly after midnight, but starting in the middle ages, it became the practice to offer Tenebrae on the evening before in anticipation, to make it more widely accessible to both clergy and laity.

Following this tradition, we will chant the Matins/Lauds of Holy Thursday on Wednesday, April 16 beginning at 7:00pm. The Schola will sit in the front, and will alternate the chanting the verses of the psalms. The clergy attend "in choir" in the sanctuary, and will chant the lessons that separate the psalms. There is a candle "hearse" at the front, shaped like a triangle, with 15 candles. As each psalm is completed, 1 candle is extinguished, until only the lone candle at the top is left: this is a powerful reminder of the Apostles abandoning Christ in His darkest hour. The "Christus Factus est" chant is sung at the end, while the candle representing Christ is hidden. A "loud noise or commotion" (the strepitus) is then made, representing the convulsion of nature following the death of Christ: the chaos of the world without a Savior. The "Christ candle" is returned to view again, then all commotion ceases. All are invited to this beautiful and moving Service.
