

A Note From Our Pastor



Forty days after his Resurrection, Jesus Christ ascended into Heaven; every year we

celebrate that event on the Feast of the Ascension. But before He ascended, our Savior promised to remain with His Church "until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). The most remarkable way in which He has fulfilled this promise is the topic of today's Gospel passage: the Holy Eucharist, which we celebrate during every Mass and receive through Holy Communion.

To keep our human nature alive, we need natural food; to go without eating is to languish and die. But by our baptism we are no longer merely children of natural parents; we are also sons and daughters of God Himself, sharers in His divine life. To sustain that supernatural life, then, we need supernatural food. Christ himself is that food. Just as children receive life and existence from their parents' flesh and blood at the moment of conception, so we receive Christian life and existence from Christ's flesh and blood in the Eucharist.

During the Mass, when the ordained priest, in obedience to Christ's own command to "do this in remembrance of me," pronounces the words of consecration ("this is my body... this is my blood") over the bread and the wine, those humble substances are changed into Christ's own body and blood. This change is known by theologians as "transubstantiation," the transformation of the substance of bread and wine into the substance of Christ's body and blood. And since Christ is alive today, residing physically in heaven, wherever His Body and Blood are really present, He himself must also be present. Thus, the Church has always taught, and the faithful have always believed, that in the Eucharist, under the appearances of bread and wine, our God is truly and sacramentally present in His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.



2024-2025 CCD Registration and Important Program Announcements

We are very blessed to have a flourishing Religious Education program at our Parish! Due to the overwhelming success of our CCD program, we wish to share a few important Program announcements for the upcoming 2024-2025 academic year:

- 1. If you have already submitted an online 2024-2025 CCD Registration Form, your child's registration will be considered complete once all of the essential paperwork is received (Baptismal Certificates, Certificates of Online Course Completion, and applicable transcripts). Copies of these important items should be emailed to SJBCCDdocs@gmail.com.
- 2. For any RETURNING CCD families/students, please note that the deadline to register your child(ren) for our 2024-2025 CCD program is Sunday, September 15 at 5pm. Program Registration will close completely for the 2024-2025 school year after this deadline, except for new families. After September 15, we will not be able to accept additional CCD registrations for returning students. All paperwork required for your child(ren)'s registration must also be received by September 15 (Baptismal Certificates, Certificates of Completion, and any applicable transcripts). Copies of these documents should be emailed to SJBCCDdocs@gmail.com.
- 3. Please note that CCD Registration for the 2024-2025 academic year will remain open only for NEW families/students.
- 4. If there are family financial concerns that may be prohibiting you from registering your child/ren for CCD, please contact our Coordinator of Religious Education, Mrs. Lauren Walters immediately to discuss possible considerations for your family. We do not want the September 15 deadline to affect your child(ren)'s enrollment in a CCD class for 2024-2025, should there be financial difficulty.



READINGS: GAL 3:16-22 LK 17:11-19

THE THIRTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Réspice, Dómine, in tesaméntum tuum et ánimas páuperum tuórum ne derelínquas in finem: exsúrge, Dómine, et iúdica causam tuam: et ne obliviscáris voces quæréntium te. Have regard, O Lord, to thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor: arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause, And forget not the voices that seek Thee. [Ps 73:20,19,23]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit is a fervent plea for God to remember His people for the sake of both His mercy and His justice. God has made promises to His people and our most fervent hope is that He will deliver on His promises. It is not so much that God needs to hear from us in this regard; when we sing of this, we are reminded of His fidelity and His generosity to all of His children.

The theme of promises fulfilled is taken up in the Epistle of Paul to the Galatians. Jesus is portrayed as the seed of Abraham, and the fulfillment of God's promise to His people. The Jewish people were in exile for 430 years, and yet, God sees them through to the promised land. Paul draws the parallel of Israel's liberation to the liberation from sin that comes to us from Jesus Christ. Paul is also drawing the distinction between the covenant with Abraham and the law of Moses – the covenant with God came first, and no law can break this relationship with God's people. The law is the outcome of the Promise, to constrain and guide the people.

The Gospel of today presents us with 10 lepers, all who are hopeful that Jesus could heal them of their awful malady. Luke's account is not found in the other Gospels, and he introduces this as part of the journey of Jesus to his death and glorification being somewhere between Galilee and Samaria, further south, still a ways off from Jerusalem. We note that Jesus no longer uses a formal declaration of healing; he tells them to "Go, show yourselves to the priests." Jesus has nothing against revealing His power to the authorities now that the end of His mission is near. The salient point here is that of gratitude, or, more correctly, the lack of it. They all required faith in Jesus for healing, and they were all cleansed. There was only one who showed gratitude to Jesus for the healing, and that was a Samaritan. Jews and Samaritans did not get along, each considering the other ritually 'unclean.' This story prefigures the healing and saving message for all of humanity. Luke, as St. Paul would also do, would leave the unbelieving Jewish people behind in favor of preaching to the Gentiles, made worthy by the reception of the message.

The Carmelite reflects on this healing as being "sacramental" – the lepers being healed was an outward sign of the love of God for his children. The appropriate response to the bounty of God is that of profoundest gratitude, just like our friend, the doubly outcast leprous Samaritan, because God's love heals everything. To Jesus Christ and to His virgin mother be all glory forever!

"Oh, why can we not realize that sin is a pitched battle fought against God with all our sense and the faculties of the soul? The stronger the soul is, the more ways it invents to betray its King!"
