A Note From Our Pastor



My Dear Parishioners,

Today we are presented with a profound, disturbing mystery. Saint John tells us, in

today's Gospel passage, that our Lord's teaching about the Eucharist, which we have been following over the last few Sundays, was so difficult, so shocking, that "many of His disciples" simply refused to accept it. As a result, they stopped following Jesus and returned to "their former way of life."

Picture the scene. A large crowd of people surrounds our Lord in the synagogue of Capernaum. Many of them witnessed the incredible miracle of the multiplication of the loaves just the day before. And yet, when He tells them about the Eucharist, about His plan to become truly present under the appearances of bread and wine so that His Divine Life will become our nourishment, they turn their backs on Him. God's creatures turn their backs on their Creator.

We can only imagine how painful that was for Him. And so He looks at His closest disciples, the Twelve, the ones He has chosen to become the foundation stones of His Church. He doesn't offer some kind of watered down explanation of the Eucharist in order to convince them to stick around. He simply asks them: "Do you also want to leave?" It was a moment of crisis. The Twelve didn't understand, rationally speaking, the mysterious doctrine of the Eucharist any more completely than everybody else.

So why did they continue to follow the Lord? Because they trusted in Him, in His person. They put more faith in the person of Jesus Christ, the Lord, than in their own limited ability to understand God. And that was a wise thing to do. By consciously exercising their faith in the midst of that crisis, and not just depending on their own limited, error-prone understanding, they lifted their spiritual maturity to a whole new level.

Saint Basil once said, "As the pilot of a vessel is tried in the storm, as the wrestler is tried in the ring, the soldier in the battle, and the hero in adversity, so is the Christian tried in temptation." I would like to share a beautiful prayer:

Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament

O Virgin Mary, Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament, the glory of Christians, the joy of the universal Church, and the hope of the world, pray for us. Kindle in all the faithful a lively devotion to the most Holy Eucharist, so that they may all be made worthy to receive Holy Communion every day.

- V. Pray for us, O Virgin Immaculate, our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament.
- R. That the Eucharistic Kingdom of Jesus Christ may come among us!



We are very blessed to have a flourishing Religious Education program at our Parish! Due to the overwhelming success of our CCD program, we wish to share a few important Program announcements for the upcoming 2024-2025 academic year:

- 1. If you have already submitted an online 2024-2025 CCD Registration Form, your child's registration will be considered complete once all of the essential paperwork is received (Baptismal Certificates, Certificates of Online Course Completion, and applicable transcripts). Copies of these important items should be emailed to SJBCCDdocs@gmail.com.
- 2. For any RETURNING CCD families/students, please note that the deadline to register your child(ren) for our 2024-2025 CCD program is Sunday, September 15 at 5pm. Program Registration will close completely for the 2024-2025 school year after this deadline, except for new families. After September 15, we will not be able to accept additional CCD registrations for returning students. All paperwork required for your child(ren)'s registration must also be received by September 15 (Baptismal Certificates, Certificates of Completion, and any applicable transcripts). Copies of these documents should be emailed to SJBCCDdocs@gmail.com.
- 3. Please note that CCD Registration for the 2024-2025 academic year will remain open only for NEW families/students.
- 4. If there are family financial concerns that may be prohibiting you from registering your child/ren for CCD, please contact our Coordinator of Religious Education, Mrs. Lauren Walters immediately to discuss possible considerations for your family. We do not want the September 15 deadline to affect your child(ren)'s enrollment in a CCD class for 2024-2025, should there be financial difficulty.



THE FOURTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ...

R. Now and forever!

Protéctor noster áspice Deus: et réspice in fáciem Christi tui: quia mélior est dies una in átriis tuis super mília. Quam dilécta tabernacula tua Domine virtútem! concupiscit, et défecit ánima mea in átria Dómini. R. Behold, O God our protector: and look on the face of Thy Christ: For better is one day in Thy courts above thousands. V. How lovely are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of hosts! my soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. [Ps 83:10-11, 2-3]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit reminds us that God is our protector and sustainer. It has the appeal of the Father to look upon His anointed One, and to keep in mind His mission of mercy. The verse extols the glory and beatitude of where God is to be found, and it acknowledges the soul's yearning to be with the Creator – even to the point of fainting – that is how powerful the desire of unity with God.

We have recently celebrated the feast of S. Rose of Lima OP, V. She is quoted as saying, "Without the burden of afflictions, it is impossible to reach the height of grace. The gift of grace increases as the struggle increases." Carmelites are perfectly capable of lifting good stuff from other orders, and this Dominican tertiary is no different – this quote points to our readings of today –about the need for sanctifying grace and the abundance of God's providential care. In the Epistle, Paul categorizes the stark contrast between the works of the "flesh" [in this regard, natural disposition toward sin], with a whole laundry list of the evils that beset humanity without the action of grace in the soul. Contrasting this, Paul points to grace, the life and the action of the Spirit within us, with a corresponding list of opposing 'fruits' or virtues. We ask for God's grace and choose wisely.

In the Gospel of today, Jesus offers two principal themes. One, that we have to choose one way or the other – it seems that the entire world will practice virtue when it suits the situation, only to fall back into sin when "the going gets tough." He admonishes us all to live a grace-filled life, no matter our circumstances, going on to show how divine providence cares for all of creation. We are so precious to God, that He will fulfill what we need in adequate measure, The mastery of God is to be trusted; if we conform to His holy and adorable will, all things will be well.

OHM Teresa practiced what she would call the prayer of recollection, a particularly effective form of prayer that always lies within our power to practice, by which we keep the Lord interiorly present, and by gazing on him or speaking with him there. When we do this, we are not looking around so much for food or clothing – for in the interior 'cell' of contemplation, everything we need is always with us "lilies." God alone suffices, and to Jesus Christ be all glory forever!

"Have great confidence, for it is necessary not to hold back one's desires, but to believe in God that if we try we shall little by little, even though it may not be soon, reach the state the saints did with His help. For if they had never determined to desire and seek this state little by little in practice, they would never have mounted so high."
