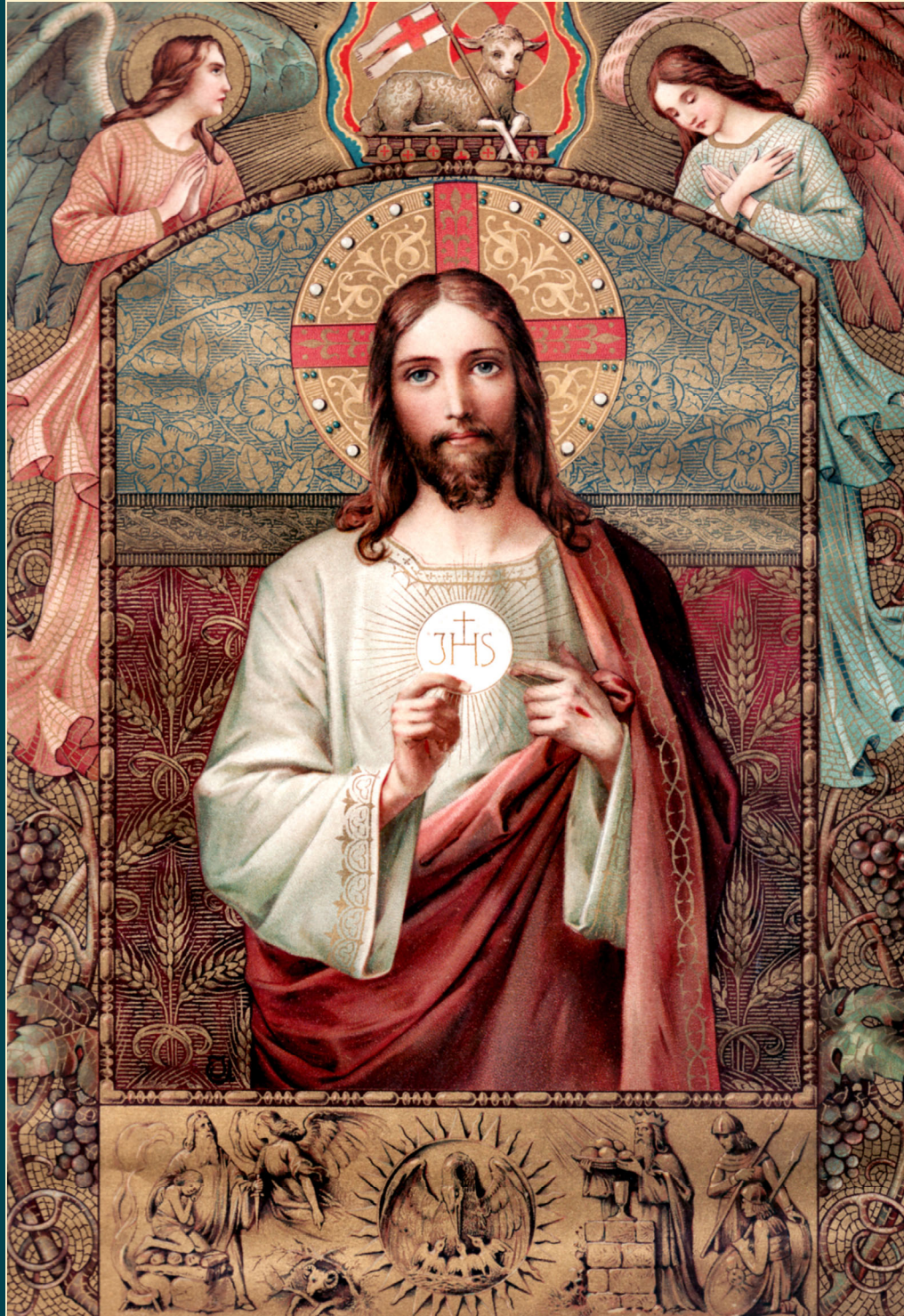

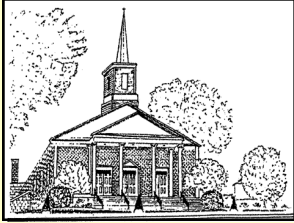

### A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

In the aftermath of the stunning miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish, a long conversation follows between Jesus and the people. They use the same words but with different meanings. They are talking "apples and oranges." In the wake of this miracle, the people are looking for more bread and more wonders. Jesus tries to draw them to seek something deeper. He calls it "bread from heaven," "living bread" and "the bread of eternal life." The people seem to think that the Lord is speaking about an endless supply of bread like the manna that was given to the Israelites throughout their decades-long trek through the desert. To their astonishment, Jesus says that He Himself is that "living bread," the "true bread from heaven" both in His teaching and in what we will come to know as His Eucharist. They are speaking about the body while Jesus is speaking about the soul. Apples and oranges.

We live in a time of enormous and expensive preoccupation with the body and physical appearance. It is critical to many people today that they "look marvelous." For many of them it is more important to look good than to be good. Huge sums of money are spent on diets, body-building, fitness centers, cosmetics and plastic surgery. The condition of our soul should be of more concern to us because the state of our soul affects everything else about us, even our appearance.

Spiritual distress manifests itself in the body. Spiritual health is about more than being stress-free. If we were to take an individual and satisfy all of his or her material needs by providing an unlimited budget for food, shelter and clothing, dissatisfaction would soon surface because we have further needs that surface only after the more basic ones are satisfied. Once a person has enough food, thought is given to shelter and decor. Once shelter is found, clothing and fashion become the focus. After clothing, safety and security are needed followed by job satisfaction and personal fulfillment. With the satisfaction of each level of need, our desires escalate. Finally, when every apparent need has been met, one realizes a need for God. Just as a sailor will be fully satisfied only when he meets the sea, so we will be fully satisfied only when we encounter Christ.

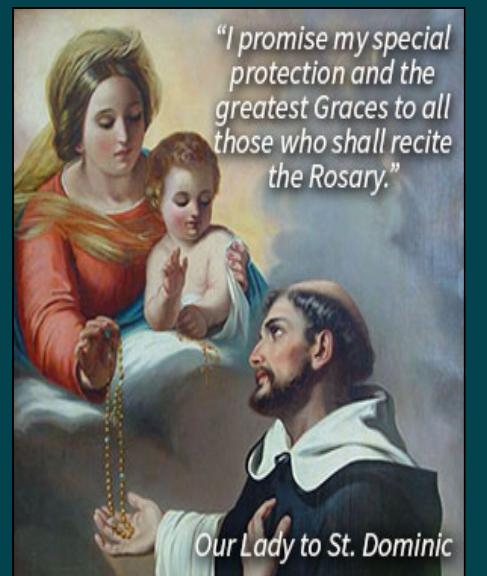

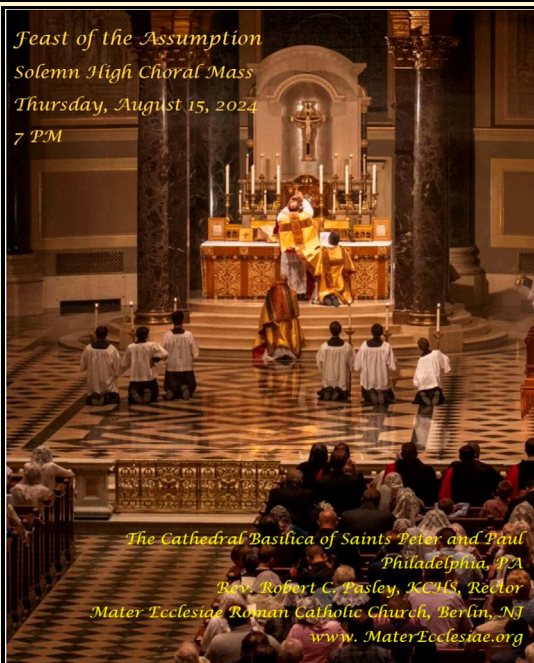

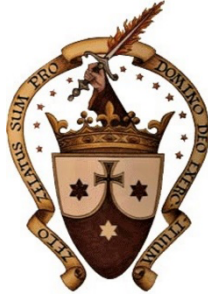

## The Carmelite Corner

READINGS:  
1 COR 15:1-10  
MK 7:31-37

### THE ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

☩. Praised be Jesus Christ... ☩. Now and forever!

*Deus in loco sancto suo:*

*Deus inhabitare facit unánimes in domo:  
ipse dabit virtútem et fortitúdinem plebi suæ.*

**God in His holy place:**

**God, who makes men of one mind to dwell in a house:  
He shall give power and strength to His people.**

[Ps. 67:6,7,36]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit reminds us that God dwells in His holy place. In his might, He gathers His children – providing for them and providing strength for them. The Epistle provides strength through a resurrection account to the Church at Corinth, which was going through some turmoil of self-aggrandizement at the time. Paul is careful to recount that this fulfilled prophecy, and it is the power of God that raised Jesus from the dead. The emphasis is on God’s greatness, not that of the Corinthians. The color and credibility of the account is the progressive appearances of Jesus to Peter [Mary Magdalen saw the risen Jesus first – but remember the audience – women were not considered credible witnesses], then all the Apostles, then to 500 [viz. a large number] at one time. Paul considers himself “born out of time” – he was a persecutor of Jesus and His Church [cf. ACTS 9:4, 22:7, 26:14] also, Jesus appeared to Paul after the Ascension.

The Gospel presents this power of God at work through the healing action of Jesus. The account gives details of Jesus going from Sidon to the Sea of Galilee through the “10 [coastal] cities.” It is almost in passing; however, this is some 50 miles – nothing further is said about it; however, it is the kind of detail that gives greater color and credibility to the Gospel account. The exact location of the miracle is not clear. The word Mark uses is *παρακαλοῦσιν* [*parakalousin* = implore], with the nuance of “calling alongside of” – and one can see the root of “Paraclete” in play. Mark gives us the petition for the Holy Spirit of God to be at work. And yet, what gives greater color and credibility to the miracle is that Jesus doesn’t simply speak a word for healing, or simply lay His hands on the poor fellow – there is a whole ritual, with six actions in total: the taking aside, putting hands in the ear, spitting, touching the tongue, looking heavenward/groaning, and a command to be healed. Jesus spitting – did He not have manners? Actually, saliva was thought to be of therapeutic value at that time and place. We are part of a very “human-contact” brand of healing, a kind that people would understand. And, as we see frequently in the Gospel of Mark, Jesus commands that no one be told of this wonder; but human beings, what they are, they pronounce the wonder all the louder. One gets the sense that Jesus was not ready for His glory, so He wanted to maintain somewhat of a low profile.

In *The Interior Castle* of OHM Teresa, she speaks of the power of God in the soul’s journey to Him. She too, uses “contact” images, as the soul advanced in prayer cannot fully express this in words. For instance, she wants to convey the relationship of the soul to God in the prayer of the Fifth Mansions [of which there are seven]. The soul is sealed with His seal, she writes, and in this state it has very little to do except to indicate its willingness to receive the divine impress. “It does no more than the wax when a seal is impressed on it, and it does not even soften itself so as to be prepared...” May we journey to God by accepting His loving imprint.
