

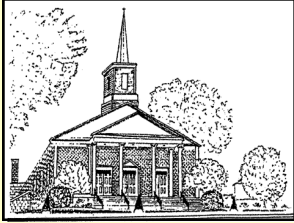

A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

Christmas seems to be a time of joy and good feelings because the world takes time to recognize what Jesus has done for us. It is good to celebrate with family and friends and to even feel good. After all we are celebrating the joy of the Word becoming flesh... What does that really mean though? How does the birth of Jesus over 2,000 years ago affect us? I can answer that in one word HOPE!

When we look out into the world today it can be difficult to see hope. However, at Christmas time it is as if the whole world takes a pause to look back to the birth of Jesus. After all, we just need to see the light in the darkness or even see a sign that all will be well. That is what the birth of Christ is, a sign of Hope! Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: the young woman, pregnant and about to bear a son, shall name Him Emmanuel. So, the Christ Child is that sign to us that all will be well.... The light that helps us find our way. To see hope amidst difficult times.

The Christmas Gospel tells us that the "Word became Flesh and made His dwelling among us." The Greek word Saint John uses for flesh is sarx. St Paul uses the same word to describe our human nature, with all its weaknesses and limitations. God truly became one of us. Christ is not a phantom or an idea. In Him, God has truly become visible. We can touch Him. We can hear Him. We can see the human face of God. Pope Benedict once asked, "What did Jesus actually bring? We still have wars. We still get sick. People still suffer. We still die. What did Jesus bring?"

His answer? "Jesus brings us God." This is what we celebrate at Christmas. Jesus brings us God. May the light of Christ in the Incarnation bring peace and joy to our families. Merry Christmas!

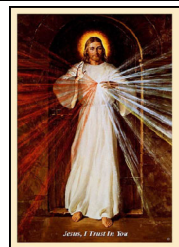


Saint John the Baptist 50 Plus Club

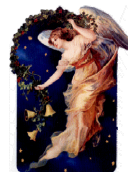

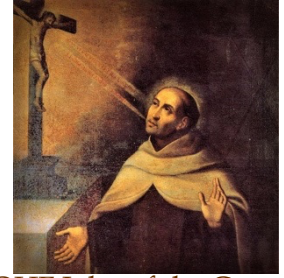

THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD – CHRISTMAS DAY

Ÿ. Praised be Jesus Christ... R̄. Now and forever!

*Puer natus est nobis: et filius datus est nobis:
Cuius impérium super húmerum ejus
et vocábitur nomen ejus,
magni consilii Angelus.*

**A Child is born to us, and a Son is given to us:
Whose government is upon His shoulder:
and His Name shall be called
the Angel of Great Counsel. [Is 9:6]**

The Christ-Child has now appeared on the earth! He comes as a helpless Child, yet omnipotent God. Our Introit rings out the news of great tidings. In our Epistle of today, the writer of the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but now he has revealed among humanity His own Presence, a Son through whom all things were made. He is the reflection of the glory of God, an emissary of the future glory which we shall share with Him. The message is that Christ is the center of all things, higher than the angels who worship Him, night and day. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, and the Father has granted Him the throne and 'righteous scepter' of a kingdom that shall never end.

The Hidden Christ (1963)

*I went into the Christmas cave;
there was no Child upon the straw.
The ox and ass were all I saw.
I sought His stable where He gave
His goodness in the guise of bread.
Emptiness came to me instead.
Filled with my Father's words, I cried
"Where have you hid Yourself?" and all

I found Him (and the world is wide)
dear in His warm ubiquity.
Where heart beat, there was Christ for me.
I went back to the Christmas cave,
glad with the gain of everywhere.
Then at His feasting board He gave
embrace. He multiplied His good
and fed in me the multitude.*

There are three Masses of Christmas – *in nocte* [at night], *in aurora* [at dawn], and *in die* [at day]. The observance of this great feast permits the Faithful to receive the Eucharist 3 times for the day. It is really hard to say Mass at dawn, if one gets to bed at 3:00a.m. after the great Midnight offering; so much easier when we had more priests. The Gospel of the Third Mass of Christmas is so familiar – it is the 'Last Gospel' from every Traditional Latin Mass – but today, it seems to have added luminosity – instead of simply recalling the Incarnation – today, we fully see and live it – the WORD becomes flesh, dwelling among us! **May His Virgin Mother, Queen of Carmel, guide our minds and hearts as we contemplate the Incarnation of Love Himself, and may the Infant King grant you all choicest blessings from His tiny hands – Blessed Christmas!**

The mystery of the Incarnation and the mystery of evil belong together.

*The dark night of sin stands in stark and sinister contrast
with the Light which came down from heaven.*

*The Child in the manger extends his little hands and his smile seems to be saying
what would come forth later from the lips of the Man:*

"Come to me all you who are weary and heavy burdened";

*and the poor shepherds out on the hills of Bethlehem, who heard the good news of the angel,
follow his call and make their way with the simple answer, "Let us go to Bethlehem."*

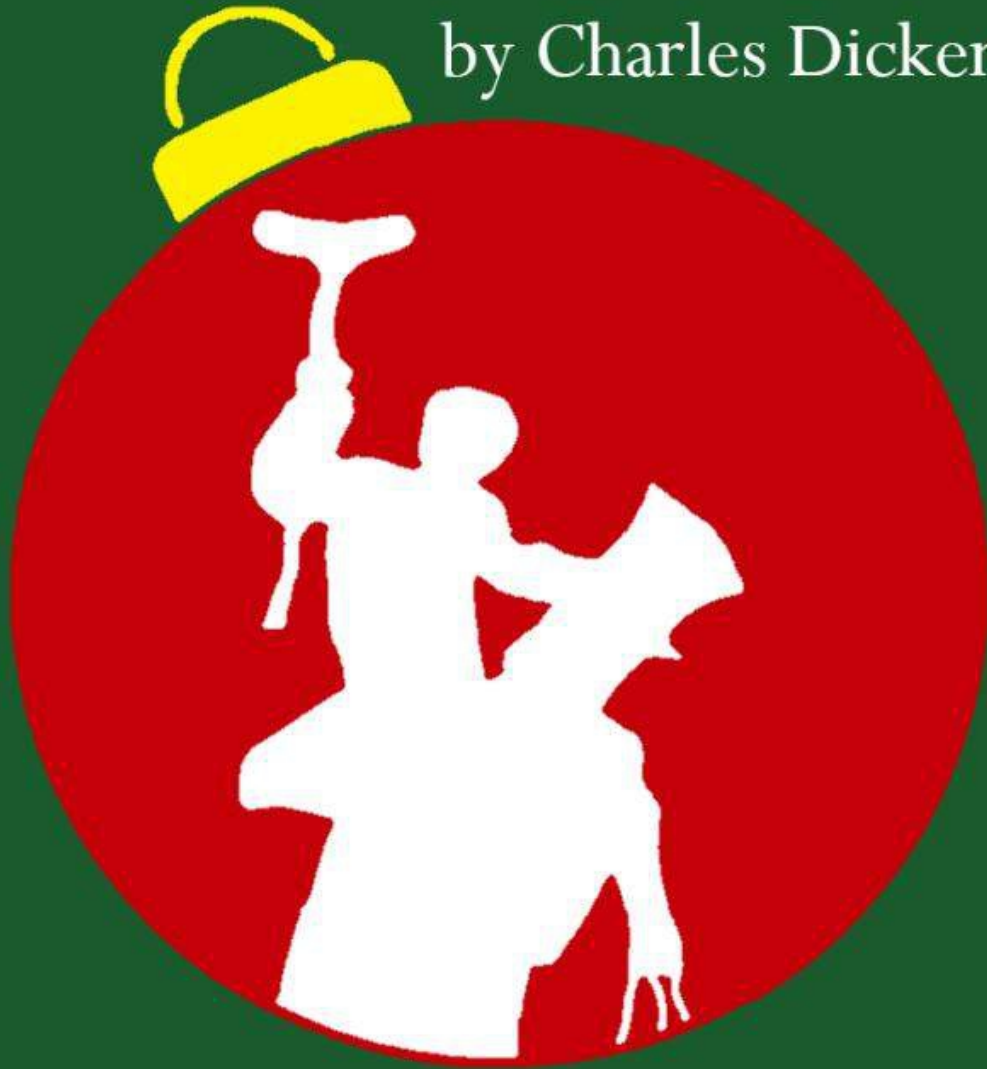
