**A Note From Our Pastor
Very Rev. Michael Wallack**

My Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the Presentation of our Lord. The birth of a child is always a special event. In the time of Jesus, Jewish traditions surrounded childbirth with a series of religious rituals that expressed just how special it was. These are the rituals that Saint Luke describes in today's Gospel passage. One of the rituals consisted in a new mother offering a sacrifice to God, to symbolize her awareness that, by bringing new life into the world, she participated in a special way in God's own power.

The Church discovers a deeper meaning in the Presentation of Our Lord. In first place, the fulfillment of the prophecy of Malachi: The Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant in whom you delight (Mal 3:1) Besides, Mary understood that Jesus had to be brought to the Temple, not to be redeemed like other first-born children, but to be offered to God as a true sacrifice.

As the Letter to the Hebrews says: When Christ came into the world, He said: "Sacrifices and offerings you did not desire, but a body you have prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not take pleasure. Then I said: 'Lo, I have come to do your will, O God,' as it is written of me in the roll of the book" (Heb 10:5-7).

To some extent, Jesus' Presentation in the Temple can be linked with the Offering of the Sacrifice of Calvary that the Mass makes present in all times and places. In the preparation of this sacrifice, as later in its accomplishment on the summit of Golgatha, a special place was reserved for the Mother of Jesus. From the very first moments of His earthly life, Jesus united Mary to the redeeming sacrifice that He had come to fulfill.

This sharing in the mystery of the Redemption was revealed little by little to the Virgin Mary. At the Annunciation the Archangel had said nothing about this. But now it would be communicated through the words of Simeon, a just and God-fearing man far advanced in years: "It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ." (Lk 2:26).

The Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, exactly 40 days after Christmas, commemorates Mary's obedience to the Mosaic law by submitting herself to the Temple for the ritual purification, as commanded in Leviticus. This feast is also called **Candlemas** due to the traditional blessing and distribution of candles today.

Candles that our Parish plans to use throughout the upcoming year as well as candles for the faithful to use during the Mass will be blessed and distributed. After this, there will be a procession of the clergy with the lighted candles and the singing of anthems. After the procession, Mass will begin. The lighted candles are held during the reading of the Gospel and during the Canon.

Special boxes containing 2 blessed Candlemas candles (at least 51% beeswax candles to be used for devotional purposes such as for the family altar, for the Sacrament of Unction, and during storms and times of trouble) will be available to all of the faithful after the Mass.

Today's Marian Anthem After the Last Gospel

We will sing the *Alma Redemptoris Mater* as today's Marian Anthem at the Last Gospel. This seasonal Marian anthem is traditionally sung from the first Sunday of Advent until the Feast of the Purification on February 2 (the original ending date of the Christmas season). This prayer tells of Gabriel's announcement and of Mary's Divine motherhood.

Sunday, February 16, 2025 will begin the 3-Week Traditional Liturgical Period of Septuagesima February 16 - March 2, 2025

"The **Liturgical period of Septuagesima** is a prelude to Lent and a remote preparation for Easter. It serves as a time of transition for the soul, which must pass from Christmas joys to the stern penance of the sacred forty days. Even if the fast is not yet of obligation, the color of the vestments worn is already violet. As during Advent, the recital of the Gloria in excelsis is suspended." *The Saint Andrew Daily Missal*

On Sunday, February 16 we will begin **Septuagesima**, the special 3-week preparation for the season of Lent in the Traditional Catholic Calendar. The three Sundays before Ash Wednesday (which is on March 5, 2025) are:

Septuagesima Sunday: February 16

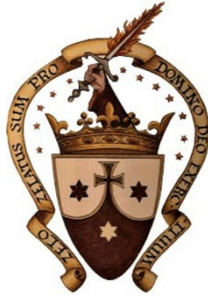
Sexagesima Sunday: February 23

Quinquagesima Sunday: March 2

The first Sunday of this time of preparation is called **Septuagesima** and is followed by **Sexagesima** and then **Quinquagesima**. These are Latin words for "Seventy days," "Sixty days," and "Fifty days," referring to the symbolic number of days before Easter Sunday. During this time before the beginning of Lent and during the forty days of Lent, violet vestments are worn and the Alleluia and Gloria are not sung.

THE PURIFICATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Ÿ. Praised be Jesus Christ... R̄. Now and forever!

Suscepimus, Deus, misericordiam in medio temple tui: We have received Thy mercy, O God, in the midst of Thy temple; secundum nomen tuum, Deus, according to Thy name, O God, ita et laus tua in finis terræ: so also is Thy praise unto the ends of the earth: justitia plena est dextera tua Thy right hand is full of justice. Ps [47:10-11]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we take pause from Epiphany-tide to acknowledge the purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The mercy spoken in the Introit is not a 'thing,' but rather the person of Jesus Christ. God's right hand is full of justice, or more precisely, righteousness – in this sense, is expressed by the word, שֶׁדֶּק, *še deq*, which contains the additional connotation of being weighed in a balance, and being found worthy. And Jesus and His virgin mother are certainly worthy of our praise. Our lesson of today is from Malachi, speaking of an angel being sent. Jesus is not an angel in the sense we customarily have before us, so don't be disturbed – the word is מַלְאָכִי, *mal 'ā kī*, [ironically, the prophet's name] literally, "my messenger" – and the Christ-child is truly the messenger of God's loving plan of redemption and the building of the Kingdom

In Jewish ritual, ritual purification after child-birth, forty days after childbirth, which was also 33 days after a boy's circumcision. The time period did the purifying, not the visit to the temple. The temple visit was to offer thanksgiving for the purification of the mother and to dedicate the male child, in thanksgiving to the Lord. So much is going on in the Gospel of today. In Mosaic law, childbirth rendered a woman unclean (cf. LEV 12:2, 4) – Mary, a good Jewish woman, fulfilled the requirements of the law. A lamb and a pigeon or turtle-dove were to be offered – Mary and Joseph are poor, and can only offer two turtle-doves. Simeon had received an answer to prayer from the Holy Spirit, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Christ of the Lord [τὸν Χριστὸν Κυρίου]. The Spirit urges him to go to the temple, where he meets the Holy Family. Simeon KNOWS that this Infant is the Christ, the salvation of His people. Simeon, in this famous canticle [the *Nunc dimittis*], exclaims that the Child is the true light Who has come into the world – not only for Israel – but for the Gentiles [viz. all the nations]. But how quickly the fourth Joyful Mystery of the Rosary turns to sorrow – Simeon plainly tells Our Lady is that Our Blessed Lord will face much opposition in His life and mission. A sword shall pierce her ψυχὴν [*psychēn* = "soul"] with the connotation of her very being, her life. She will have to rest with this knowledge some 33 years, until events unfold. The Virgin most pure shows us all how to suffer and to wait. ***Laus Deo Virginique Matri! – Praise God and His Virgin Mother!***

*"On this day, which is very much your own,
present me also to the Eternal Father together with your little Child;
and, since You have no need of the least purification, Little Mother of my soul,
let my heart, my soul be purified but in such a way that I may present myself to the Lord
and through Him I may be accepted, day by day."*

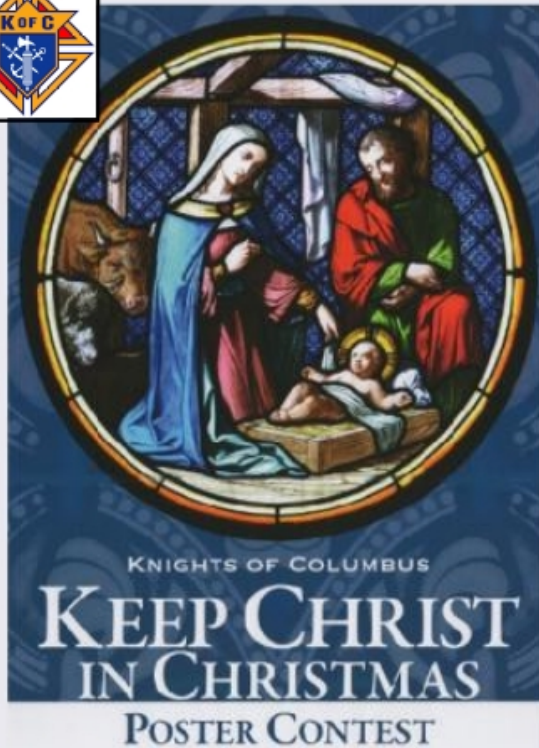

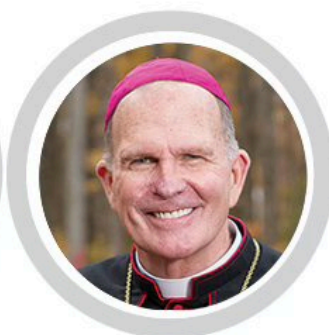

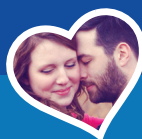
