



A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

Today's Feast marks the conclusion of the Christmas Season and the beginning of Ordinary Time. It's a feast of transition from Jesus' hidden life to that of His public ministry. It also echoes the theme of the Epiphany, in that the Baptism of the Lord is another manifestation announcing Jesus' divinity to all of His first followers and to the disciples of John the Baptist. It needs to be pointed out that Jesus did not need the baptism of John. John was baptizing as a call to and sign of interior repentance. Jesus had no need to repent. But, nonetheless, He comes to John. John resists at first but Jesus insists. Why did He receive baptism?

First, by accepting the baptism of John, Jesus affirms all that John has said and done and affirms his sacred role of preparing the way for Jesus and for a new era of grace. Therefore, the Baptism of Jesus acts as a bridge between the Old Testament prophets (of which John was the last) and the New Testament era of grace and truth.

Second, it has been said that when Jesus entered the waters of baptism, He was not baptized by the waters, rather, His Baptism was one in which all the created waters of this world were, in a sense, "baptized" by Him. By entering into the waters, Jesus sanctified water and poured forth His Grace making all water the future source of salvation.

Third, the Baptism of Jesus was an epiphany. It was a moment of manifestation. As He emerged from the waters, "Heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from Heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

This manifestation of the sonship and divinity of Jesus took place in a physical, audible and visible form so that all present would know, without question, that Jesus was the Son of the Father. Thus, His baptism is a way in which the Father introduced His Son and His Son's mission to the world.

As we prepare to begin Ordinary Time, reflect, today, upon these words of the Father at the Baptism of Jesus. Hear the Father speaking to You about the divinity of His Son. Turn your eyes to Jesus and prepare yourself to follow Him and to heed every word He speaks. He was sent into this world to draw us to the Father, allow Him to fulfill that mission in your own life.





FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Exúltat gáudio pater justi, gáudeat Pater tuus et Mater tua, et exúltet quae génui te. The father of the just rejoices greatly, let thy Father and thy Mother be joyful, And let her rejoice who bore Thee. [Prov 23:24-25]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we are still in Christmas-tide, but the Church takes pause to reflect not upon the Christ-Child, but on the Holy Family of Nazareth.

Our Gospel of today captures a pivotal moment in Jesus' early life, revealing His awareness of His divine mission while highlighting His obedience and humanity. Jesus is not having a "teenage rebellion", or other nonsense people try to promote. He is drawn to the Father, with Whom He has been for all eternity, and He is at an age when a Jewish male would begin to take on religious responsibilities. We now see Jesus expressing the understanding of His mission and purpose – and He, as God, is informing His creatures [Mary and Joseph] about this reality. It must have been hard for them to understand this transformation that was taking place. But Mary, true contemplative that she was, pondered to fully understand her Son's divine mission. The mystery of the Incarnation and the gradual unfolding of His purpose begins for both His parents and for those around Him. We are drawn into this scene to reflect upon the perfection of Christ and of the Holy Family – we are invited to draw upon this account for our own growth in wisdom and favor with God, to honor our own earthly responsibilities, and to discern God's call in our lives. Indeed, all of salvation history, woven by God with the fiber of humanity, passes through the daily events of families.

In our Epistle, St. Paul instructs the Church at Colossae [and us] about the Christian virtues as evidenced so perfectly by the Holy Family: compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, forgiveness, and love – all these are essential attributes for reflecting character of Christ to be practiced within the family and with all whom we meet. In our lives, gratitude should be a recurring and vital response to God's grace and blessings, and in all aspects of life — in words and actions—everything is to be done in the most precious name of Jesus, reflecting His lordship and mission.

Carmelites have a great devotion to the Holy Family. The life of a Carmelite is one of fellowship with Christ, to be contemplative as was Mary about the glory of her Son, and to be a strong, silent type as was St Joseph. May the Holy Family inspire us all, and may the Infant King grant us all choicest blessings from His tiny hands!

"He [Jesus] enlightens his parents and clarifies their authority, which is insufficiently aware of what awaits him in his mission.

He does enlighten them, but he remains subject to them.

He does point out to them only this: that his calling rests with a higher authority, delegated to them in certain regards. That higher authority is God, his Father..."


