A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack


My Dear Parishioners,

The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Queen of Heaven and Mother of God, is teaching us today how to follow Christ, how to become a mature Christian: by imitating her attitude of service, by sharing in her confidence in Jesus, and by joining her obedience to God's will, we will travel surely and swiftly along the path of a truly fulfilling, meaningful, and everlasting life.

At Cana in Galilee there is shown only one concrete aspect of human need, apparently a tiny one and of little importance: 'They have no wine'. But it has a symbolic value: this coming to the aid of human needs means, at the same time, bringing those needs within the radius of Christ's Messianic mission and salvific power. Thus there is a mediation. Mary places herself between her Son and mankind in the reality of their wants, needs and sufferings. In her position as mother, she puts herself 'in the middle', that is to say, she acts as a mediatrix, not as an outsider. She knows that in this way she can point out to her Son the needs of mankind, and in fact, she 'has the right' to do so. (Pope St John Paul II *Redmptoris Mater*).

As we attend and hear Mass this weekend, let's ask her to intercede on our behalf, just as she did for the newlyweds at Cana, so that even when we don't seem to have any wine left in our hearts, God's grace will still flow freely in us and through us.

The Carmelite Corner

THE SECOND SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Omnis terra adóret Te, Deus, et psallat tibi: psalmum dicant nómini tuo, Altissime. Let all the earth adore Thee, O God, and sing to Thee:

Let it sing a song to Thy name, O Mo

Let it sing a song to Thy name, O Most High. [Ps 65:4]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we are Epiphany-tide, and the Church turns our attention from the events of Nazareth to a social gathering in Cana of Galilee. The feasting went on longer with more people than they had planned for - to run out of wine would have been a societal disaster in a small town in Galilee. Mary observes the dilemma that the newlyweds faced, simply telling Jesus the material fact, "They have no more wine." There are so many levels of meaning transpiring. One might think that Our Lord was being rude addressing his mother as "woman" - we need to bear in mind that this was common in Jewish expression of that time strange to our ears. Even deeper - the "woman" was to crush the head of the serpent [Satan]. "The woman" asks her Son's intervention; she begins the events of the ministry of Jesus that ultimately leads to His death and glory. The miracle is utterly Marian at the source. What is remarkable is that John's Gospel expresses, "the water made wine." The master of the feast receives this with no fanfare or knowledge from whence it came. Innocuously, the miracle is reported - perhaps it was "more of the same" to the Gospel writer. Note well the superabundance of Jesus - the wine is the absolute best, and six jars for ritual washing would have held 120-180 gallons of wine – surely, they were happy for quite some time! Note that this first miracle occurred at a wedding - Jesus hallows marriage with His presence then, and He does now. Marriage is the "type" of the relationship of Jesus, the Bridegroom, and His splendid Bride, the Church.

The Carmelite knows that Mary leads us to Jesus; there was never anybody on earth as close to Jesus as Mary. Mary obtains joy for us, not just in the "wine that maketh glad the heart of man" [cf. Ps. 104:15] – but in all matters. The Carmelites are uniquely Mary's order; our whole life is to imitate her sublime virtues. As it was for the newlyweds, it was Mary who helps to solve our problems, as well. And, at the behest of the Queen of Carmel, miracles do happen. We wish to be close to Mary, for closeness to Jesus through Mary is authentic joy – not joy as the world believes it to be. Her voice echoes through the ages to us, "Do whatever He tells you."

Laus Deo Virginique Matri! - Praise God and His Virgin Mother!

"Now, if this is so—and it is—there is no point in our fatiguing ourselves by attempting to comprehend the beauty of this castle; for, though it is His creature, and there is therefore as much difference between it and God as between creature and Creator, the very fact that His Majesty says it is made in His image means that we can hardly form any conception of the soul's great dignity and beauty."


