A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

Our Responsorial Psalm this week offers us a very strong foundational teaching, "The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our needs." (Psalm 145). This is a very important fact because it helps remind us of the reality that God is not a wishing well. We have to remember that a mature faith understands that God gives us what we need not what we want always. He is much like a good parent who only gives what is good and necessary to His children because they do not always know what is best for them.

Both our First Reading and our Gospel reflect the notion that God provides for us as well. These are both miracles revolving around food which can be seen as a metaphor for God providing for us our very sustenance. It also reminds us that when we offer our gifts and talents to the Lord His grace can take them and perfect them well beyond our capabilities.

I'd like to share a further insight from a commentary I read recently. "In today's readings, Our Lord reminds us that disciples know they always have something to learn and to pass along to the people that they help. Christians never stop being disciples; Our Lord always has something to teach us and is always there to help us. In the First Reading Elisha, who was the disciple of the prophet Elijah, learned the miracle of the multiplication from his master. Elijah once asked a widow for the last bread she had to feed herself and her son (1 Kings 17:8-16), and when she explained her situation Elijah told her the Lord had promised to provide for them all, and so it came to be. Elisha in today's First Reading was doing something similar, but because the Lord promised to help him. The Lord said a miracle would happen, and it did. Just as the Lord had helped Elijah and the widow, Elisha knew to encourage his servant to begin handing out the bread, and the miracle happened. Prophets of the Lord, just like his disciples, know they are working with the Lord, not alone, helping Him to do something for souls.

The disciples in today's Gospel are proactive: they know from Our Lord's question that He wants to feed the people who came to see Him, and it seems He's asking them to make it happen. Phillip sees it as impossible, even if they had enough money to feed them, due to the size of the crowd. Andrew at least starts asking around, but the resources come up short. Both lost sight of the fact that Jesus said "we." When we feel Our Lord is asking something difficult or impossible, we must remember that, like in today's Gospel, He will be with us and help us. We never stop being disciples, so the Master never abandons us to our mission. We just have to take it one step at a time, even when sometimes it seems difficult or impossible." (e-priest.com)



THE TENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

ab his, qui appropinquant mihi: et humulitávit eos quies est ante sécula, et manet in æt**é**rnum: jacta cogitátum tuum in Dómino, et ipse te enútriet.

Cum clarmárem ad Dóminum, exaudívit vocem meam, When I cried to the Lord, He heard my voice, from them that draw near to me; and He humbled them, Who is before all ages, and remains forever: cast thy care upon the Lord, cast thy care upon the Lord, and He will sustain thee. [Ps. 54:17-18, 20, 23]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit reminds us that God, in His justice, will humble those who are proud. The humble before God simply trust in Him, casting their cares upon Him, and He will sustain them by His unfathomable mercy.

The Epistle finds the continuation of the first Letter to the church at Corinth. Paul speaks of their good fortune to no longer be heathens, worshipping "dumb idols," εἴδωλα τὰ ἄφωνα [eidōla ta aphōna], i.e., idols that were mute, incapable of communication or help – for they were just non-living images. Jesus sends the Holy Spirit, Who bestows all kinds of graces and gifts, but in all of these, there is only one Spirit in operation, providing it all. The Corinthians are reminded, in no uncertain terms that they are not to be congratulating themselves for their perceived spiritual excellence – they were given this as free gift. The Gospel continues this admonition against self-congratulations. The justice of God, by faith in Christ Jesus – there is no distinction, for all humanity ὑστεροῦνται τῆς δόξης τοῦ Θεοῦ [hysterountai tēs doxēs tou Theou = fallen short of the glory of God [cf. Rom 3:23]. The pharisee in this story presumably is praying; actually, he is comparing himself to others and congratulating himself for his spiritual 'excellence.' How much more Jesus values the prayer of a repentant sinner who dares not look heavenward. God justifies the humble, but He opposes the proud. Truly, who are we, when we are compared to the Almighty?

The virtue of humility is an essential component of Carmelite spirituality. Even a cursory survey of The Way of Perfection and The Book of Her Life of OHM Teresa of Ávila (not even to mention references in *The Interior Castle* and other works) reveals that she mentions humility more than one hundred times. Truly, it would be easier to enumerate Teresa's writings which do not mention humility—for none are to be found. Humility finds its etymology from the Latin, humus – this is soil, actually the droppings of a worm. This root finds its use in humor and human, as well. Compared to God, we are dirt, and, in fact, that is from which we were fashioned – Memento, homo quia pulvis es, et in pulverum reverteris – Remember, man, that thou art dust, and to dust thou shalt return [cf. GEN 3:19]. However, humility is not think *less* of one's self, as much as it is thinking of one's self *less*. Teresa mentioned two important components of humility: walking in truth and self-knowledge. We aim to be like the publican who know what he truthfully was, for humility before the throne of grace is powerful, indeed. To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!

"Remember that true humility consists in being ready for what the Lord wants to do with you and happy that he should do it, and in considering yourselves unworthy to be called his servants."
