A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

Our Lord spoke so often about "the Kingdom of God." His first public sermon began with "The Kingdom of God is at hand," and from then on He kept talking about it, as in today's Gospel. If there is a Kingdom, there must also be a King, and if there is a King, there must be subjects. That's how He sees the Church, as a Kingdom, not merely as some kind of club. Today we can ask ourselves if that's how we see Church. When we pray, "Thy Kingdom come," do we mean the same thing that Jesus meant when He taught us that prayer?

God's Kingdom is the realm where hearts obey Him out of faith and love. The kingdom of this world is the realm where hearts obey themselves out of selfcenteredness, egoism, and fear. If we really want to help Christ redeem the kingdom of this world by transforming it, through His grace, into the Kingdom of Christ, we have to keep hearkening to the King and carrying out His commands, even when they are uncomfortable for our selfish tendencies.

Obeying someone else, though, is almost always a challenge for us sinners. Jesus knows this, and so He doesn't ask us for blind, mindless obedience. He uses parables to explain and promise that by following and obeying Him, our lives will be fruitful. The virtues that give true, lasting beauty to our lives, that give our lives meaning and deep happiness (virtues like wisdom, courage, self-control, and Christ-like love), are like the seeds in the Lord's parables. They are planted in our hearts at baptism, and as we follow and obey Christ in our daily lives, they grow and flourish. Being good citizens of Christ's Kingdom is the sure path to an abundant spiritual harvest here on earth and forever in heaven.





The Carmelite Corner

THE FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Dóminus inluminátio mea et salus mea, quem timébo? Dóminus defénsor vitae meae, a quo trepidábo?

The Lord is my light and salvation, whom should I fear?
The Lord is the protector of my life:
Of whom shall I be afraid?
PS. 2

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, our Introit [entrance song] introduces us to a liturgy that reminds us to maintain an unshakeable faith in the providence of God, and to heed his call in all our affairs. We are to live life with zeal and joy, knowing that God has all of this life firmly in His hands. The Epistle is from the first letter of Paul to the Romans – with its message that the sufferings of our current human condition are nothing compared to the glory we are to receive in Heaven. Every creature 'groaneth and travaileth in pain.' This promise of future glory, however, does not keep us from seeking to perform whatever good we can do within this life; quite the contrary, we abide peacefully with the sufferings of this age as we seek out and perform the will of God in the building of His kingdom.

Is there any one of us who cannot identify with the Gospel of today? How many times have we set about tasks under our own direction, only to have them end up in a smoldering heap? When we experience the miraculous, we quite naturally identify with Peter – we are all sinful, falling short of the glory of God. But that is just fine. Dependence on the Master will lead us to superabundant results and to the glory that we have been promised. We go one way [fishing for fish], and then the good God steers us in another direction [fishing for souls]. Prayer is the conduit by which we gain God's will for us.

Part of the Carmelite charism is to have utter dependence on God, and to the world this seems rather odd. 'Why aren't these people doing something?" Why do they hide behind walls [i.e., our nuns]? The life of a Carmelite is one continuous prayer – we are doing something! The world thinks that prayer and dependence on God are a waste of time, but there are too many incidents of the efficacy of prayer to think otherwise. Life itself is miraculous, as are all the favors we have received from the loving hand of the Good Shepherd. To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!

"Lord, You see how often I fail, but I am never astonished at it...
I enter into myself and say: 'Alas, I am at the first step as before!'
But I say this in great peace, without sadness,
because I know that You know perfectly how fragile is our nature
and You are always ready to help us. What, then shall I fear?
As soon as You see me fully convinced of my nothingness, You stretch out Your hand to me;
but if I should try to do something great, even under the pretext of zeal, You desert me.
So, all I have to do is to humble myself, to bear with meekness my imperfections.
Herein lies, for me, true holiness..."
