

A Note From Our Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

Jesus was focused on His mission. He worked hard to communicate His message of salvation, to train His apostles, to heal the sick and comfort the troubled. In fact, He worked so hard to fulfill His mission that it was "impossible for [him and his disciples] even to eat."

But not everyone appreciated Jesus and His dedication to His mission. Even members of His own extended family, St. Mark's Gospel tells us, thought He was crazy. And the more popular and respected religious and cultural leaders of the time rejected Him. They actually accused Him, as this weekend's Gospel passage makes clear, of being an instrument of the devil.

It must have been hard for Our Lord, to stay focused on His mission, to be faithful to what His Father had sent him to do, when He ran into so much opposition, mockery, and misunderstanding. And yet, He persevered. He didn't let criticism, rejection, jealously, mockery, or persecution of any kind interfere with his loving fulfillment of God's will.

Where did He get the courage to be true to His identity and mission even when those closest to Him were rejecting Him? In His relationship with the Father – His heart was anchored not in the shifting sands of this fallen world, but in the everlasting love of the Lord, in doing God's will. As today's Psalm puts it: "My soul looks for the Lord more than sentinels for daybreak."

We too find it difficult to be faithful to our mission in life, to God's will for us, to His commandments and to the circumstances that He permits to trouble us. We too run into opposition, mockery, misunderstanding. We too need courage. And so, we too need to anchor our hearts in the Lord, so that we can persevere, be strong, and endure.



The Sacred Heart of Jesus: The Treasure of Tenderness and Mercy by Bishop David M. O'Connell, C. M. June 7, 2024

Our Holy Father Pope Francis has announced at his General Audience on June 5, 2024 that he is preparing a document on the Sacred Heart for release next September. He expressed his intention "to say something meaningful to a world that seems to have lost its heart."

The heart as a symbol of love dates back to ancient times and the writings of philosophers. In the Middle Ages (12th to early 14th centuries), the heart appeared in popular artwork of the time, gradually finding a place in many religious representations associated with Christ. In the Renaissance period (late 14th to 17th centuries), depictions of references to the "Sacred Heart of Jesus" became commonplace.

Today, devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the most popular Catholic traditions. It is rooted in Christ's human incarnation as well as the fullness of his love for humankind. The "Heart" of Jesus - True God and True Man - represents his Divine and Human compassion and mercy.

In 1353, Pope Innocent VI created a Mass honoring the Sacred Heart. In 1670, the Feast of the Sacred Heart, with a Mass and Divine Office, was established in France by Father later St. John Eudes (1601-1680). Three years later, French Sister later St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) reported visions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to her superior shortly after Christmas, telling her that Jesus allowed her to rest her hand upon his beating heart.

In the course of these visions, Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary how his Sacred Heart should be honored with prayer, Eucharistic Adoration and reception of Holy Communion of the First Friday of each month. Additionally, acts of consecration, reparation for sin and devotion to the Sacred Heart were prescribed. The feast day, raised to the rank of Solemnity, is celebrated 19 Days after Pentecost, always on Friday. Representing Divine love for all humanity, the month of June is annually dedicated to the Sacred Heart. This year, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated on Friday, June 7.

Let us pray. Jesus, gentle and humble of heart.

Touch our hearts and make them like your own.

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that we, who glory in the Heart of your beloved Son and recall the wonders of his love for us,

may be made worthy to receive an overflowing measure of grace from that fount of heavenly gifts. Amen.

The Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary

- (1) "I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life."
- (2) "I will establish peace in their homes."
- (3) "I will comfort them in all their afflictions."
- (4) "I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death."
- (5) "I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings."
- (6) "Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy."
- (7) "Lukewarm souls shall become fervent."



- (8) Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- (9) "I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored."
- 10) "I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts."
- (11) "Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart."
- (12) "I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

The "Time After Pentecost" in the Traditional Calendar and in the Traditional Latin Mass

The traditional Roman rite observes at this point of the calendar the "Time After Pentecost." Extending over almost half of the year, it is

the great season of the Holy Spirit, the age between the first Whitsunday and the Last Iudgment.

While Advent commemorates the world before the Incarnation, and the Christmas and Easter cycles recall Christ's earthly life, the Time after Pentecost corresponds to the age, broadly speaking, in which we currently live. The Preface of the Holy Trinity reminds us of the ongoing work of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in our lives, while the green vestments betoken our hope in God while we await the Second Coming.

Each Sunday of the Time after Pentecost equips us with the graces and lessons we need in order to remain faithful disciples in this post-apostolic age. While reminding us of the "day of visitation" at the end of time (Epistle), today's Sunday recalls our Lord's infinite mercy and love for us and the immense value of penance: "There shall be joy before the angels of God upon one sinner doing penance," proclaims today's Gospel. (Luke 15, 1-10) We should therefore cast our cares upon the Lord with confidence and hope (Epistle & Gradual).

READINGS: 1 PET 5:6-11 LK 15:1-10

THE THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Réspice in me et miserère mei, Dómine, quóniam únicus, et pauper sum ego: vide humilitátem meam et labórem meum: et dimitte ómnia peccáta mea, Deus meus. Look thou upon me, O Lord, and have mercy on me; for I am alone and poor. See, my abjection and my labor, And deliver me from my sins, O my God.

Ps. 24:16-18

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, right from the outset of the liturgy at the outset of the Sundays after Pentecost, we see the reminder of how frail humanity is before God, and how much we have dependency upon His mercy and providence.

The Epistle is from the first letter of Peter - our exaltation and our human effort are inversely proportional - the more we understand our dependence upon God, the more will be our ultimate glory. We are to be on our guard, because the evil one and his minions never tire of trying to trip us up. The devil cannot do a thing against God - he is a created thing, with no power over the Creator. The only way the devil can "get back" at God for the eternal punishment is to pluck as many of God's children away from Him. God's grace through Christ Jesus is adequate for us to remain faithful. Not only do we receive grace, but God pursues us - not just the majority of His children, but each and every one of them. Jesus loves each one of us uniquely - He loves as if each child were the only one; He loves as if each child were the "all." If Jesus had to endure His passion and death for just one soul - how profound and generous His love is! The Gospel of today underscores this in the metaphor of the Good Shepherd leaving the "ninety and nine" to seek out the one lost sheep. We see in Scripture that repetition is the means by which we find added emphasis; Jesus adds the metaphor of the woman who loses a coin - she sets the nine coins aside, lights a candle, sweeps the entire floor, searching high and low until she finds the lost. Such is the love of God, seeking out the very worst of sinners, until they come to repentance. Jesus affirms that repentance of those that were lost causes more joy in Heaven than those who are just [however, let's not go wandering off. 😂].

The angel at Fatima called the world to begin doing penance once again. Indeed, the call to penance and conversion has been the constant appeal of Marian apparitions throughout history [but especially within the past hundred years, or so], and the Carmelite takes this seriously. Let us all pray and sacrifice for conversion! To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!



- High school seniors entering a non-Catholic college.




