

#### A Note From Our Pastor Very Rev. Michael Wallack

My Dear Parishioners,

November is here and we remember in a special way the holy souls of our loved ones who have gone before us in faith. This is a time when we focus on praying for those who have died and we assist them with our prayers.

Pope Saint John Paul II always spoke so beautifully about praying for our deceased loved ones and at the celebration of the millennium of the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed in the year 2000, he encouraged this practice when he said,

"In praying for the dead, the Church above all contemplates the mystery of the Resurrection of Christ, who obtains salvation and eternal life for us through his Cross.

Thus, with Saint Odilo we can ceaselessly repeat:

'The Cross is my refuge, my way and my life.... The Cross is my invincible weapon. The Cross repels all evil. The Cross dispels the darkness.'

The Lord's Cross reminds us that all life is illumined by the light of Easter and that no situation is totally lost, for Christ conquered death and opened the way for us to true life. Redemption is brought about in the sacrifice of Christ, by which man redeems the debt of sin and is reconciled to God" (Tertio millennio adveniente, 11.7).

Let us take some time during this month to remember our loved ones and to renew our trust in the Holy Sacrifice of our Lord Jesus Christ on the Cross, which opened the gates of eternal life for us and gives us the confidence to pray the words:

> "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

> and the souls of all the faithful departed,
> through the mercy of God,
> rest in peace. Amen."



### November: The Month of the Holy Souls

We have arrived at the month of November, which is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Throughout November, Holy Mother Church asks us to offer sacrifices and prayers for the remission of debt incurred by those faithful departed souls whose sins were already forgiven. In order to assist these souls, we will remember the names of the deceased that are noted on the back of our All Souls Day envelope (sent to all parishioners, example of one pictured below) for the entire month of November. An All Souls envelope was also enclosed in the latest Parish mailing. Although no stipend is required for this act of charity, your sacrificial contribution would be gratefully accepted. Envelopes can be returned by mail or dropped off in the collection baskets at Church.

Our Church also offers an important opportunity to relieve the Holy Souls in Purgatory through fervent prayers for the deceased. By visiting a cemetery and praying every day from November 1 to November 8, one may also gain a plenary indulgence for the faithful departed. Here is helpful information on obtaining plenary indulgences for the Poor Souls:

#### SIX GENERAL RULES FOR OBTAINING A PLENARY INDULGENCE

- 1. One must be in a state of grace at least when performing the indulgenced act
- 2. Sacramental Confession (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- 3. Reception of Holy Communion (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- 4. Prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be)
- 5. Complete detachment from sin (even venial sin)
- 6. Performance of the indulgenced act (usually a special good work with certain conditions, places or times)

#### INDULGENCED ACTS TO BE PERFORMED FOR A PLENARY INDULGENCE

From November 1 to November 8: Visit a cemetery and pray for the poor souls (1 per day, with the indulgence applied to a faithful departed)

November 2: Visit a Church or Oratory and recite one Our Father and the Creed

A partial indulgence can be obtained at any time by visiting a cemetery and praying for the Poor Souls.

#### "Resumed Sundays after Epiphany"

The Church "year" begins on the First Sunday of Advent each year. Because the date of Easter changes, the number of Sundays from *Epiphany to Lent* and from *Pentecost to Advent* is therefore variable, depending on the date of Easter. If there are more than 23 Sundays after Pentecost, the Introit, Gradual and Communion of the 23rd Sunday after Pentecost are repeated on all the remaining Sundays (until the last Sunday of the Church year) while the Collect, Epistle, Gospel, Secret and Postcommunion are taken from the Sundays after Epiphany that were omitted earlier in the year.

Thus, today we are celebrating the "Fourth Resumed Sunday After Epiphany. The Collect, Epistle, Gospel, Secret and Postcommunion are taken from the Mass of the Fourth Sunday After Epiphany, which was omitted earlier this year due to an early date of Easter this year. Next Sunday (November 10) we will celebrate the "Fifth Resumed Sunday After Epiphany", and the "Sixth Resumed Sunday After Epiphany" will be celebrated on November 17.

The Introit, Gradual and Communion for today's Mass are repeated from the Mass of the 23rd Sunday after Pentecost. Please refer to the complete printed Propers for today that are available at all of the Church entrances.

## The Carmelite Corner

#### THE RESUMED FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Dicit Dominus: ego enim scio cogitations pacis, Et non afflictionis: invocabitis me: et ego exaudiam vos et reducam captivitatem vestram de cunctis locis. The Lord saith: I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction: you will call upon me, and I will hear you and I will bring back your captivity from all places.

[JER 29:11,12,14]

Dear people in Christ, we know what you are thinking – "I thought that Epiphany was in January – what is this celebration doing in November, and what is this 'resumed' stuff?" Your answer: The traditional Roman Missal has 6 Sunday Masses assigned for the Time After Epiphany and 24 Sunday Masses assigned for the Time After Pentecost. Taken together, with the other Masses assigned for Sundays, the traditional Roman Missal has a total of 53 Sunday Masses (enough for each week of the year). Depending on how early or late Easter falls, there may be less than 6 Sundays after Epiphany and more than 24 Sundays after Pentecost. When this happens, those prayers and readings from the Sunday Masses not said during Time After Epiphany are said on the Sundays between the 23rd and 24th Sundays After Pentecost (the 24th Sunday After Pentecost is always said on the Sunday immediately before the 1st Sunday of Advent). On these "Resumed" Sundays After Epiphany, the proper chants (Introit, Gradual, Alleluia, Offertory, and Communion) of the 23rd Sunday are repeated. If there are less than 24 actual Sundays after Pentecost, the Mass assigned for the 23rd Sunday After Pentecost is omitted. There – confused yet? Sundays after Pentecost.

The Epistle of today tells the Church at Rome to pay attention to the Commandments and to the law of love as Jesus had taught – for, indeed this is the fulfillment of the law. The Gospel of Matthew paints the picture of the necessity of faith in Jesus Christ. The Lord, who is the Author and Director of all creation has the situation well in hand. The Apostles get a powerful lesson in faith and trust in the Lord's providence. How often do people get fearful when the "boat" of our lives get wind-swept and tossed by the waves of the vicissitudes of life – fear not! For He is with us.

The Carmelite promises to live a life in conformance to the evangelical counsel of obedience, abiding in trustful, watchful anticipation of the good that the Lord will provide us. Indeed, God's desire for us is to know Him, love Him, and trust in His love and mercy. He desires us to go on a pilgrimage through this life, like a child learning to ride a bicycle, with our Father running alongside of us, lest we fall. We live with faith, trust, and confidence – not in our own abilities – but in His! Yes, God calls us to trust in Him. Trust that He is with us every step in our journey no matter how straight, narrow, steep, or rugged the path; and Mary and the Carmelite Saints show us 'The Way'. For St. Thérèse of Lisieux her 'little way' is revealed through her "*The Story of A Soul*." Thérèse understood that smaller we are the more 'God stoops down to reach us', like reaching down to pick the smallest daisy in a field of wildflowers.

One would think it easy to adore a God Who has offered us nothing but His very best – but we stumble. God, Who is Himself perfection, Who has nothing but love for us, demands and deserves our complete trust. Yes, He requires of faithful souls an abandonment to His holy Will – a Will that is often difficult for us to understand or comprehend. God alone does not, and cannot, break His promises. He arranges every detail in our lives. Oh, if we could only learn to trust Him to do so! How much more peacefully would we walk through the afflictions in this life. With how much more confidence would we face the future! In this faith, trust, and love – we know that He will always work towards our good, trying to lead us to our ultimate home in the glory of Heaven. To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!

"Have great confidence, for it is necessary not to hold back one's desires, but to believe in God that if we try we shall little by little, even though it may not be soon, reach the state the saints did with his help. For if they had never determined to desire and seek this state little by little in practice they would never have mounted so high."
