A Note From Our Pastor



My Dear Parishioners,

God cares more about what happens on the inside of our lives than what happens on the outside: He wants our hearts. That's what he's trying to explain to the Pharisees, and to all His disciples, and to us. It is quite possible to appear perfectly Christian on the outside while being perfectly selfish on the inside. We can go to Mass regularly, avoid obviously lewd or sinful behavior in public, say prayers so that others will notice - we can do all those things exteriorly while constantly entertaining evil thoughts and self-centered desires in our hearts. That kind of divided life, which is called hypocrisy, can't last. As the old saying goes, unless we live according to what we believe, we will soon start believing in accordance with what we live. Or, as Jesus puts it elsewhere in the Gospels (cf. Matthew 6:21): where our hearts are, there our treasure is.

True followers of Jesus Christ can never be satisfied with merely exterior piety; we can never consider ourselves superior to others just because our sins are less visible. That's what the Pharisees did, and it blinded them to God's love; in fact, it tragically turned them into enemies of God.

True religion has exterior manifestations, certainly, but they are meant to flow from and give expression to the experience of the heart. The heart is the place where we decide for or against our conscience, for or against God's will. Our friendship with Christ, and the purpose, strength, and vigor that flows out of that friendship, depend on our inner allegiance to Him; looking like goody-two-shoes on the outside can never substitute for that. Jesus doesn't care what we look like to others; He cares about who we really are. And so, that's what we should care about too.



2024-2025 CCD Registration and Important Program Announcements

We are very blessed to have a flourishing Religious Education program at our Parish! Due to the overwhelming success of our CCD program, we wish to share a few important Program announcements for the upcoming 2024-2025 academic year:

- 1. If you have already submitted an online 2024-2025 CCD Registration Form, your child's registration will be considered complete once all of the essential paperwork is received (Baptismal Certificates, Certificates of Online Course Completion, and applicable transcripts). Copies of these important items should be emailed to SJBCCDdocs@gmail.com.
- 2. For any RETURNING CCD families/students, please note that the deadline to register your child(ren) for our 2024-2025 CCD program is Sunday, September 15 at 5pm. Program Registration will close completely for the 2024-2025 school year after this deadline, except for new families. After September 15, we will not be able to accept additional CCD registrations for returning students. All paperwork required for your child(ren)'s registration must also be received by September 15 (Baptismal Certificates, Certificates of Completion, and any applicable transcripts). Copies of these documents should be emailed to SJBCCDdocs@gmail.com.
- 3. Please note that CCD Registration for the 2024-2025 academic year will remain open only for NEW families/students.
- 4. If there are family financial concerns that may be prohibiting you from registering your child/ren for CCD, please contact our Coordinator of Religious Education, Mrs. Lauren Walters immediately to discuss possible considerations for your family. We do not want the September 15 deadline to affect your child(ren)'s enrollment in a CCD class for 2024-2025, should there be financial difficulty.



The Carmelite Corner

THE FIFTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

V. Praised be Jesus Christ... R. Now and forever!

Inclina, Dómine, aurem tuam ad me, et exáudi me: salvum fac servum tuum, Deus meus, sperántem in te: miserére mihi, Dómine, quóniam ad te clamávo tota die.

Bow down Thine ear, O Lord, to me, and hear me: save Thy servant, O my God, that trusteth in Thee: O, Lord, for I have cried to Thee all day. [Ps 85:1, 2,3]

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Introit reminds us of our human tendency to 'bargain with God' – I have given You this, so give me that. But God does not mind – He loves hearing from His children, and sincere prayer is pleasing to God. This shows that we long for God, and God will answer our trusting, continuous prayer.

In the Epistle, Paul admonishes the church at Galatia [also known as Gaul, an ancient area in the highlands of south-central of present-day Turkey] to abide in the Holy Spirit, and to act on this Spirit in all their affairs. Today, as then, normal living brings us face-to-face with pride and envy [and a whole host of associated sins], but Paul is clear. If one sees another acting against the Spirit by trafficking in these sins, that person is to fraternally correct the offender – what we would consider a Spiritual Work of Mercy. But do so in meekness, lest pride or arrogance come into us and spoil the whole thing. God can see if a person behaves badly and tends to reward people with the same measure as they give to others. Let us stay to the task of humbly looking out for the good of others.

In the Gospel of today, we see one of the earlier accounts of the mastery over death that Jesus has, prefiguring His own victory over it. Pity that poor woman, a widow who has lost her only child – what is left for her in this life? Jesus observes what is taking place, and He stops the funeral procession. We arrive at the expression: \dot{o} K \dot{o} pio \dot{o} [ho Kyrios = the Lord], the first time in the Gospel of Luke that this nature of Christ is expressly revealed. Jesus tells the poor woman not to weep, for He knows what He is going to do. In our lives, Jesus knows precisely what He is going to do – we just get uneasy, because WE don't know what He is going to do. And this is a great study in the value of faith – Jesus makes all things well if we but wait on Him and let Him demonstrate this in our lives.


The Carmelite knows that God, Who is Himself perfection, Who has nothing but love for us, demands and deserves our complete trust. Yes, He requires of faithful souls an abandonment to His holy and adorable will, one that is frequently difficult for us to understand or to follow. As long as we are simple, upright, God-fearing, and departing from evil – placing our hope in God and not in the foibles of a changing world, He, who has care of His servants, will turn our hardships into blessings.

To Jesus Christ be all glory forever!
